Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - April 14, 2024 Third Sunday of Easter

Today's readings outline the ways to know and love God and become witnesses of the Lord's saving truth. Last week in John's gospel Thomas took the rap for demanding tangible signs of the Resurrection of Jesus. This week in Luke's account Jesus spontaneously offers concrete evidence of his presence to quell his disciples' unuttered questions. He invites them to touch him. He insists on eating in their midst. He illuminates their minds—this on a par with the greatest of his miracles!—so they finally get what he has been saying to them all this while about the law, the prophets, and himself. Lastly, Jesus ordains that they be witnesses of everything they have heard, seen, know, and have touched.

How do we reconcile the gospel treatment of Thomas' need for a sign with the free handouts lavished on the whole gang in this story? We do not have to. Jesus obviously did not. In both cases Jesus does not hesitate to offer what is necessary to bring his disciples to faith. Clearly Jesus is not offended by our human need for assurances. What is more important to him is that we do, in fact, climb on board the ark of faith. So spread your fleece. Ask for what you need. Make your bargain; name your price. Jesus wants you on board. Whatever it takes to get you there, Jesus is prepared to pay the price.

And if we spend any time considering this story at all we realize that Jesus already has. Jesus demonstrates with the sign of the cross that the price of buying us back for God is never too steep. That is how dearly our participation in the grand story of love is valued. Jesus wants you—like the ultimate recruitment poster for the ultimate call to service. Your testimony is urgently requested. Your life's witness is the most precious thing in the universe as it stands in this moment. Heaven holds its angelic breath awaiting your decision. The testimony of Thomas—"My Lord and my God!"—is already on record. So are those of Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Paul, and all the saints.

The witness that salvation history depends on now is yours, and mine, because the story of salvation is still unfolding, and grace is still operating. How many of us are prepared to make our full-hearted profession of faith? That is what we do next, you know. After I stop preaching, the assembly takes to their feet and offers their response. You do not have to get up if you do not want to. You can sit there and give it more time, consider your options, reflect on what it means to say: "We believe in one God, and in Jesus, and in his Spirit, and in the church." The moment of our testimony has arrived. In the words of Saint Ignatius, *I wish not merely to be called Christian, but also to be Christian*.

Do you want to know more about palliative care?

As Catholics, our faith in Jesus Christ has much to teach us about living well until the end of life. A parishioner may be interested in the topic of palliative care because:

- A person or a loved one has been recently diagnosed with a chronic or life-threatening illness.
- Caregivers and/or family members:
- \$\dagger\$ may wonder about their decisions regarding the care of a person who has recently died
- are grieving the death of a loved one and are seeking a supportive community that they can learn with
- are trying to discern their gifts to accompany, care for, and support caregivers and the person who is ill.
- A person may want to:
- understand how palliative care is different from Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD)
- ♦ understand the Church's teaching on end-of-life care questions.
- A person may simply want to learn more about palliative care

Facilitators Claire Colistro and Bev Pulyk invite you to participate in learning sessions on Horizons of Hope: A Toolkit for Catholic Parishes on Palliative Care. The program will help parishioners, caregivers, and family members who may be facing a terminal illness to learn more about palliative care. Throughout four modules, the learning and discussion sessions address themes such as understanding the dying process, discernment and decision-making at the end of life, accompaniment, and the importance of building Compassionate Communities.

The four-module program will take place in the Chapel on Tuesdays and Thursdays April 16, 18, 23, 25 (10:00am to noon each day). To register call or email the parish office by April 12.

Word of the Week:

Eucharist!

Eucharist, Greek for "thanksgiving," is the formal name for the Mass. Also part three of the four-part movement of the Mass: the Introductory Rite, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, and Concluding Rite. The Liturgy of the Eucharist includes the people's offering, the Eucharistic Prayer, and the Communion rite. We celebrate our faith in two main units of liturgy that serve as the spiritual lungs of the church: Word and Eucharist. The first tells the story of how we came to be the People of God. The second gives thanks for this astonishing reality. In addition, the church teaches in Lumen Gentium that the faithful, "as true witnesses of Christ," are "obliged to spread the faith by word and deed," which includes taking part in the Eucharistic sacrifice, "the source and summit of the Christian life." From the General Instruction of the Roman Missal: The Church has arranged the entire celebration of the Liturgy of the Eucharist in parts corresponding to precisely [the] words and actions of Christ (no. 72). Allow Easter to help you locate yourself in the vast sweep of history and see that you are the intended beneficiary of God's grace since the beginning of time.





