

Alleluia! Alleluia! I have seen the Lord! The words of Mary Magdalene echo through the centuries into our hearts and minds. Her joyous words point us to a changed reality. After the suffering and execution of Jesus, this jubilant proclamation by Mary pierces through darkness and despair. I have seen the Lord! Jesus had been raised from the dead! Nothing like this had ever happened before in the known history of humanity. Jesus had raised Lazarus and a little girl from death during his ministry, but as far as we know, Lazarus and the little girl lived into old age and then passed away in the natural cycle of life. The resurrection of Jesus was different! Jesus was transformed! He walked through walls, appeared and disappeared instantly, not limited by his physical body. Jesus was alive and he had conquered death for all people. The beautiful liturgy of the Easter Vigil reminds us that the story of our redemption started with Genesis, the creation story, the Big Bang. In the beginning was the word and the word was with God and the word was God. (John 1:1) In the quiet of Easter morning, stillness swept over the earth as the word was fulfilled; love triumphed over sin and darkness, over pain and death.

We now live with hope and faith in a love so all-embracing that we trust that we will be treasured and loved throughout eternity. Jesus died on the cross to reveal the deep love of God for each of us and the resurrection completed and deepened that revelation. God loves us! God loves us so much! We cannot comprehend it. I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord.

The glorious happening on Easter morning was not observed. There were no witnesses at the resurrection, in contrast to Friday when hundreds were present at Jesus' death, the sky darkened, and the world shuddered. However, though quiet, the resurrection was not hidden. The Gospels are filled with accounts of Jesus appearing after his resurrection to many believers in different situations. *God allowed [Jesus] to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses.* These witnesses announced the good news of unending love and mercy for all people. Our caring and compassionate God wants us to know, that after all the suffering, Jesus was resurrected. God wants us to know that the resurrection of Jesus

signifies our resurrection in the future. We are Easter people! We can be filled with hope and joy, knowing that God is love and that despite the troubled world we live in, love has and will continue to triumph over war, hunger, despair, and death. Alleluia! Alleluia! *I have seen the Lord*!

Word of the Week:

Octave

From the Latin for "eighth," a group of eight; in music, the eighth note; in the liturgical year, an eight-day celebration of the highest-ranking feasts, or solemnities, of Christmas and Easter. The Octave of Easter is followed by the Easter season, which lasts 50 days and ends with the feast of Pentecost. During the eight days that make up the **Octave** of Easter, the liturgy never ceases to remind us of the great mystery of the Resurrection of Christ! The Easter Season is determined by the eight weeks it takes to get from the Resurrection to Pentecost. In Lent, we embrace penitential practices in anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection. What happens next is nothing less than the birth of the church. Easter itself is an **octave**, or eight-day feast. In liturgical practice, the **Octave** of Easter is like a week of Easters as we light the Paschal candle, sing the Gloria, and continue to contemplate the wonder that death has a door. Jesus passed through it, and so will we. Is a week too long to ponder this? Today you witness something that opens your eyes to the power and glory of God's love in a way no other event could. Jesus raised from the dead! How is it possible? Only through the love of God, which makes all things possible. Spend this glorious day in fascination at the miracle you are witnessing. After Easter, Jesus continues to appear, teaching them more about God's kingdom for 40 days, a sacred number symbolizing completeness. Then Jesus returns to his Father in the Ascension. The disciples devote themselves to prayer from that hour until Pentecost, when the Spirit comes, and the church is launched into prime time. What should we be doing from Easter through Pentecost? Imitating the disciples: celebrating, contemplating, learning, and praying to prepare for the mission ahead. Continue to keep your eyes and heart open, and you will see that God never tires of loving you and raising you up. What a miracle!
