

March 9, 2025

As Lent begins, we continue in this Jubilee year of hope to celebrate, pray, bless, learn, inspire, and challenge. Lent presents us with a golden opportunity each year to practice life in a new way. It invites us to let old habits die and allow new ones that stretch and strengthen us to form. How is the season of Lent different from other seasons? This is the season in which we tend to the spiritual tasks of penance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in order to deepen our experience of God's presence and strengthen our faith. Lent 2025 is not a place you have ever been before, so keep your eyes open. The path is not the same, nor is the person walking it. It is Lent 2025; the time is right. Let us look at the Scripture on this First Sunday of Lent!

Hearing the story of Jesus' temptation on the First Sunday of Lent, we are left to our imagination. Tradition says that Jesus was tempted with every temptation known to humankind. This was to assert his total humanness. Otherwise, he could not have been so totally identified with our human lot. But temptations are not sins. What we call "temptation" is not meant to make us sin; it is meant to enable us to conquer sin. It is not meant to make us bad; it is meant to make us good. It is not meant to weaken us; it is meant to make us stronger through the ordeal. That is why Jesus had to win his test-so he could be our victory and salvation as we meet, head on, the Satan's that tempt us to choose the lesser good. And he had to win the test of being tempted away from the cross because he knew that we could not save ourselves.

That is what I love about today's Gospel. Having difficulty-letting God, be the center of his life was not foreign to Jesus. That is the beauty and realism of today's Gospel story! It is a daring move on the part of the early Church to give the story of Jesus being tempted such a prominent place in the Gospel. It is also a very comforting move. Here is Jesus who, as no other, was tuned in to God, and whose daily bread it was to do the will of God. Here is Jesus being tested. You, Jesus of Nazareth, where do you stand? What are you prepared to live for and, if necessary, to die for? How committed are you? What is it worth to you that God's kingdom come? What is your life full of?

This grace filled time is an opportunity for us to let Jesus take over our lives. Lent means "spring." New life grows in springtime. Through our temptations God will bring new life to us. Lent is a gift from the Church to us. We receive it gratefully to face both our gifts and our limits, to look in a spiritual mirror to face ourselves, our demons, and our God. We go together, with Jesus, into the desert of our souls. [continued on page 3...]


Opus Dei Reconciliation Events
