SUNDAY - April 11, 2021 Divine Mercy Sunday

Thomas is held up as the poster child of doubt—the one who had to see and touch the wounds of the risen Jesus before he would believe in the resurrection—and he is also the straw man for Jesus' words, "Have you believed because you have seen me?" But give Thomas a break: He was only asking for what the other apostles had—they believed because they had seen the Lord already! Thomas is also the set-up man for an even more important teaching: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Only the first generation of Christ's followers would know him in the flesh. The rest of us believe through hearing the good news about him. By his doubting, he strengthened faith. Because Thomas was bidden to see and hear in person, I learn to believe unswervingly and with steady faith that human death was overcome by the death of Christ crucified.

Thomas should go down in legacy as Thomas the Confessor rather than the name by which he is more frequently known. Thomas set his eyes on Jesus for only a moment and knew just who he was. "My Lord and my God!" he shouted. Twenty centuries later, it remains the best and truest response. Many things can—and have—been said about the apostle Thomas and his infamous demand to see the risen Christ in person rather than rely on the reports of the other disciples. Some have vilified him as the arch doubter, while others have praised him for his persistence in seeking out the risen Christ for himself. In the end it shouts to us: Thomas got on board! From the start Jesus calls disciples for the expressed purpose of going on a fishing expedition for his sake. The roll call of those who got in the boat with Peter is not random: Thomas the confessor, Nathaniel the reformed cynic, Zebedee's now humbled sons, and two mysterious "others"—one of whom is the Beloved Disciple. No point in spilling more ink in the controversy of who the Beloved Disciple is, which will not be solved here. It is more intriguing to consider who the other "other" might be: Does that leave room for you or me in the boat?

The early church community knew just what to do: They laid everything down, every worldly advantage, as a resource of the church for the sake of the gospel. This kind of full-scale surrender of goods seems unthinkable today, but what sort of parallel offering of absolute confidence in Christ might we make? Laying down our daily lives as witnesses to the truth in word and deed is not

too much to ask. As we look at that cross, we must make up our minds, once and for all, who Jesus is for us. His empire, founded on love, remains the only reign that will last. If Jesus is our Lord and God, as Thomas claimed him, then it will not be hard to know what to do. All we have to do is follow, and he will be happy to lead us.


FRIDAY, April 16th
