From the desk of Father William

It strikes me that this beautiful Gospel story is in fact a description of what we are about here. The parallel is just too obvious. It is not difficult to recognize in those two disciples who are on their way to Emmaus. And look what it is that makes them slowly come to the point of recognizing Jesus as risen, as being very much with them. It is a recognition that enables them to snap out of their dejection and disillusionment so that they can take life up again with a sense of purpose and hope, strengthened and renewed. What makes that possible for

of purpose and nope, strengthened and renewed. What makes that possible for the presence of Jesus.

But those are exactly the activities that we engage in while we are here. Every Sunday as disciples of Jesus have done for centuries, we too come together around the Scriptures and around the bread and wine that we share. And do we not do this in the presence of Jesus, who discloses for us in the Scriptures, so that we find in them a bit of light in our darkness? And do we not follow that up by sharing the bread and wine in which the same risen Jesus continues to give himself to us so that we find nourishment and hope on life's journey? What today's Gospel story describes is what we are doing here. What overcame the first disciples of Emmaus overcomes us as well.

We are here together in Jesus' name. All of us have been baptized in Jesus' name. We recognize him to be present in us and among us; we are very much a Jesus community. Is not one of the reasons why we come together on Sunday that we cherish our belonging to Jesus and that we want to support each other in our holding fast to Jesus. I know that not everything about us as a Jesus community is perfect. The same is true of our life of faith. It has its ups and downs; faith is something that needs to be constantly reappropriated in the light of new life experiences. While we may pride ourselves in being believers, we know our life of faith can be called into question and challenged at any time. And at other times can be seriously tested and shaken. We have our moments of peace and joy, but also of doubts and questions.

Considering today's Gospel story, may I ask you to be faithful to what we do here, to cherish it and give it all the care it needs and deserves? It is the firm conviction of our Christian tradition that in our coming together, in our searching the scriptures, and in sharing the bread and wine, we are privileged to meet the risen Jesus and to be renewed by him, so that we can get on with life with a sense of purpose and hope. We pray that it may indeed be so. The Eucharist is not an escape, any more than Emmaus ended up being an escape. The Eucharist is however, a source of peace, not because we escape a troubled world, but because we find in Him who is the Eucharist, a way and the strength to live in that world. On another note, I am away at Canadian Federation of Priests meetings in Saskatoon from Monday to Wednesday this week.. I fly back to Saskatoon on April 29 until May 4 to give a retreat to the priests of Saskatoon and Prince Albert Diocese. Pray for me as I prepare for this retreat.
