SUNDAY - April 18, 2021 Third Sunday of Easter

Have you ever noticed that the stories of the appearance of the risen One all turn into stories of mission? The reason for this is that the resurrection of Jesus is true only to the extent that we, as disciples of Jesus, continue to give hands and feet to his mission. That may explain why the original disciples of Jesus were panic stricken. They knew themselves implicated in the resurrection of Jesus and they began to discover that the resurrection of Jesus is not something to which you can be an impartial observer. You cannot take a distant look at it and say: "isn't that interesting?" and then go on with business as usual. If we say that Jesus has been raised, then we cannot help being affected by it and being drawn into it. It will make us into Easter people.

At Easter we light the Easter candle, but then Jesus throws it back to us when he says: "You are the light of the world." So may the light of the Risen Jesus burn in us. Then light and clarity will come into our own life. There will be warmth and light in our world. It happens when we profess Jesus as Lord, as the Risen One, not just with our lips, but with our hands and feet.

Throughout the NT we hear of God's mercy and love and the constant striving of God to rescue us from our self-inflicted misery. As the rabbis say, the whole Bible can be boiled down to four words: We sin. God saves. Jesus' ragtag band of followers spread out to every major urban center: Jerusalem, Antioch, and eventually Rome. They were ridiculed, persecuted, or simply ignored by most, but they made inroads and their passion persuaded a few in each town to follow "The Way."

Early church historian Fr. Columba Stewart, O.S.B. describes the apostles as the movement's cutting edge: "To study the lives of the apostles," is a bit like what we've been doing with the Hubble telescope—getting as close as we can to seeing these earliest galaxies. This was the big bang moment for Christianity, with the apostles blasting out of Jerusalem and scattering across the known world."

In closing, dear friends, the risen Jesus needs us to make his resurrection true. The risen Jesus wants to give bread to those who are hungry through us who share our bread. For those who are thirsty he wants us to be water, living water. He is that through us. He wants to comfort those who are sick. He does it through our care and attention. He wants us to give strength to those who are discouraged. He does that through us. He wants to console those who mourn. He does it through our sympathy, through our understanding word, through our helping hand. Those who are lonely he wants to bring in community again through us. He wants to forgive those who are burdened by shame or guilt. He does it by our willingness to engage the other and forgive.
