From the desk of Father William

In Jesus, the risen One, God has shown his real face; in him a faithful God has enlightened our darkness. By raising Jesus from the dead, God himself has ruptured our darkness and death. He has broken it open. Light and life have broken into our world. The resurrection faith is all about not discounting the possibility that God can make new women and men out of us. How? Well, let's look at the Gospel today. Through Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the beloved disciple, we are given three different reactions to the finding of the empty tomb and three different ways of coming to believe in the resurrection of Jesus.

Mary Magdalene finds the empty tomb and runs to the apostles to tell them her astonishing news. St John's is the only account where the apostles are directly involved in finding that the tomb was empty, and where neither Jesus nor angels were there to give any guidance about the meaning of it. The Beloved Disciple was present with Peter to see the discarded burial-cloths within the tomb, and he at once realized what this meant: that Jesus was risen from the dead! Let's remember that this gospel is truly great news, both timeless and very actual for us right here and now. Somehow, we can relate to the first hearers of that good news, if we try to put ourselves within the story as told by Saint John today. Are we like Mary Magdalene who told the others the news of resurrection? Or like the apostles who responded by running to the tomb to see for themselves.

On Easter morning, the stone was rolled away from the mouth of the tomb. Could we think of our heart as a tomb awaiting a resurrection? Can we identify anything akin to a stone that is holding us back from enjoying the fullness of life? It could be an addiction, a compulsion or some hidden and dark secret that we have never shared with anyone. Pope Francis declares, "We are called to be people of joyful hope, not doomsday prophets!" Because of the resurrection of Jesus, we can all have hopeful joy, and go out to share it with the world. The message is clear: God waits for each one of us to come home to Him. He invites us in freedom and that is the joy of this day.

On another note, we received an email form our refugee sponsorship agreement holder to say that we can expect our refugee families to be arriving soon. The notification stated that our families application (Holy Cross and St. Pats) are "at the last stages and that they will be flying soon." We can expect the family to be contacted soon for travel and this is Easter joy for them and us. We are looking for accommodation for both families who need to live close to each other. Anybody out there who owns a duplex? The refugees sponsorship agreement states that rent can only up to \$1500 a month including utilities!
