
Vision Statement

From the desk of Father William

Why does the Father love the good shepherd, according to Jesus? Because the good shepherd is willing to lay down his life in order to take it up again. That means he acts without being led by his fears. He acts out of love and respect for the precious gift given him, namely his life, his talents, and his very ability to work. Jesus is willing to do anything to save us! In this beautiful image of shepherd, the Scriptures try to describe the kind of relationship that God wants to entertain with each of us. God's presence becomes a protective presence: he

is our shepherd; he guides us along the right path. In him, our drooping spirits, weary and searching, finds comfort and rest, and is given life again. His presence to us is life-giving and nurturing; for he leads us to fresh and green pastures, and to restful waters. He is worthy of our trust, for he is true to his name. Therefore, we have no reason to fear the threatening forces within us or outside of us; they will not swallow us up, they will not destroy us. We rely on God's protection and comforting presence. What is more, this protection and comforting presence of God to each of us affirms all that we are; it gives us a sense of dignity, it gives us a sense of our own worth that no one can take from us. That same God generously supplies us with what is lacking in our lives, showing us goodness and kindness. He raises us up, giving us a place in his own house, a share in his own life. Indeed, the Lord is my shepherd.

In the end brothers and sisters, it is rather quite simple, our Christian faith is about us knowing we are cared for, that we know ourselves held and sustained by a God who has become a God-for-and-with uspeople. When we pray for "vocations" we still seem to mean a call to religious life or to priesthood. It is obvious that our Church today is in great need of good shepherds, totally committed to the Way of Jesus. However, in praying for vocations don't forget to pray for your own. Every single baptized person has a 'vocation'. Everyone is called by God to play a specific role in the Christian community and in the wider community. Our Christian communities can only grow and thrive when every member makes a contribution to the wellbeing of the whole. It is absolutely basic for us to ask ourselves at all times, "What does God want me to be? What are my particular gifts? How can I offer these gifts in service to the wider community and to my own Christian community? You're part of the fold. We must learn to choose these kinds of things so that our free will becomes more conformed to the will of the Father. Then our behavior will improve as does our "image" as an authentic Christian. Pope Francis is an excellent role model of this transformation. In his new encyclical Rejoice and be Glad he reminds us that everyday life can lead to holiness and holiness means being yourself and being kind. Let us join him as supporters and cheerleaders of the kind of Christian lesus would like each of us to be. In the meantime, let us continue to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd calling each of us to his side and to the fold.
