Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - April 23rd, 2023 Third Sunday of Easter

Sometimes a scripture commentary is so good it deserves to see the light of day beyond the scholars. R. H. Smith should have last word on the significance of the Emmaus story: so, the lordship of Jesus is not known or manifested in acts of war or vengeance or in dreadful and mighty signs but is attained through a cross and expressed in a meal—an act of hospitality, peace, brotherhood, and sisterhood. The power of heaven is waiting for us at the table. And what we are privileged to discover in the scriptures is even more forcefully brought home to us by sharing of the bread and wine. Yes, indeed, on this God-given Jesus we may feed. The Emmaus story is like a gospel within the gospel. It is so rich a lesson that it serves as a summary of our own bonding with Jesus Christ. The Emmaus story speaks to people of all ages. We can see ourselves in these two weary travelers on their journey, the faith and hope they have lost, the future they have hoped for fallen apart. And yet they met an unknown friend walking the road with them, who gave them a fresh insight, and connected the new world with the world they knew. And, of course, he is present in a particular way in the Eucharist, in the breaking of bread, full of the many meanings that breaking bread had for Jesus himself, during his life and after the resurrection.

It is not too difficult to recognize ourselves in those two disciples who are on their way to Emmaus. Is it? And look what it is that makes them slowly come to the point of recognizing Jesus as risen, as being very much with them; it is a recognition that enables them to snap out of their dejection and disillusionment so that they can take up life again with a sense of purpose and hope, strengthened and renewed: what makes that possible for them is their searching of scriptures and their breaking and sharing of the bread, in the presence of Jesus. But those are exactly the activities that we engage in while we are here. Every Sunday- as disciples of Jesus have done for centuries- we too come together around the scriptures and around the bread and wine that we share. And do we not do this in the presence of Jesus, who discloses for us the Scriptures, so that we find in them a bit of light in our darkness? And do we not follow that up by sharing the bread and wine in which the same risen Jesus continues to give himself to us so that we find nourishment and hope and life's journey? What today's Gospel story describes is what we are doing here? What overcame the first disciples of Emmaus overcomes us as well.

That is why we need to come together and search the scriptures, much like the disciples of Emmaus. And we search the Scriptures not just to satisfy our intellectual curiosity, but rather to find there a word from a gracious God- however clumsily mediated sometimes by the preacher- a word that enables us to negotiate our way through life and to keep our hearts burning within us, trusting and holding on to a God who, in Jesus dead and risen, shows himself to be a God-for-and-with-us- people. In the light of today's Gospel story, may I ask you to remain faithful to what we do here, to cherish it and to give it all the care it needs and deserves? It is the firm conviction of our Christian tradition that in our coming together, in our searching the scriptures, and in our sharing the bread and wine, we are privileged to meet the risen Jesus and to be renewed by him, so that we can get on with life with a sense of purpose and hope. We pray that it may indeed be so.

Summer Faith Study: Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues

St. Andrew's Cathedral is pleased to offer another Summer Faith Study this year. The course is Bishop Robert Barron's study on sin and virtue. Over 8 weeks, the course will look at what the Catholic tradition calls the Seven Deadly Sins and contrasting them with what Bishop Barron refers to as the Seven Lively Virtues. The study is designed to increase understanding, promote reflection, and encourage practical action in people's lives to strengthen our wills against the many temptations to sin. Together we will explore how to combat pride with humility, turn envy into admiration, anger into forgiveness, sloth into zeal, avarice into generosity, gluttony into asceticism, and combat lust with chastity.
