

"I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the lord GOD. I will seek the lost...You are my sheep, the sheep of my pasture and I am your God, says the Lord GOD." Ezek 34

In today's Gospel according to John, we hear the familiar story of the Good Shepherd. This passage has a deep reassuring message for the reader, but understanding the context provides a richer understanding. Jesus' use of the shepherd analogy hearkens back to Ezekiel's Old Testament writing. God the Father admonishes the shepherds of Israel for having been self-serving. He promises to be the Good Shepherd who will rescue and care for His people. In today's reading, Jesus is speaking to and admonishing the Pharisees for being 'hired hands' and not caring for the people of their flock. The Good Shepherd's distinguishing characteristic is his heartfelt love for his flock. Shepherding is not a job; it is a vocation. Jesus is the New Testament Good Shepherd.

Just prior to this particular account the Pharisees had interrogated the man who had been cured of blindness, by Jesus, on the Sabbath. The young man defended Jesus as being from God, but the Pharisees drove the young man out, telling him that he was born entirely in sins and admonished him for trying to teach **them**. Jesus assures the blind man that he has it right, and it is the Pharisees who are blind. Then he proceeds to try and teach the Pharisees not only that leadership should be driven by love, but he also reveals his true identity as Son of God.

Jesus knows his flock as intimately as the Father knows Jesus and Jesus knows the Father. And, Jesus says, *his flock* knows him with that same intimacy. That is a profound statement. How is it that we know Jesus with this level of intimacy? No casual relationship would be good enough to reach that bar. The Pharisees, although learned religious leaders, were considered to be outside of the flock. Although they knew Scripture and the rules of the Law very well, they had not learned how to emulate the love that they could have found therein, the love of a merciful God. The love that pursued God's Chosen People relentlessly, the love that never failed. They had the head knowledge but not the heart conversion. The people bore the burden of the Law applied without mercy and suffered from a leadership that was prideful and self-serving.

Jesus explains that he will lay down his life for his sheep, even the sheep outside his flock. He will do so of his own accord, and he will raise it up again. This in itself is both a paradox and a mystery. A dead shepherd isn't usually of much use! But in this case, it has been our salvation. The message here is not just for the Pharisees, the leaders, who are called to be good shepherds. It is for the sheep too, who are called to truly understand the deep relationship in which the Good Shepherd longs to engage us. He went the distance for us. How far will we go for him?

Love. Mercy. Genuine relationship with God. Always. The Good Shepherd invites us. He has sent the Spirit to accompany us. His love never fails.

On this World day of prayer for Vocations let us pray for more leaders with heart. Relying on the Spirit,
