SUNDAY - April 24, 2022 Divine Mercy Sunday

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, which is news to Catholics who have not paid much attention since the year 2000, when Pope John Paul II inaugurated this feast to be celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter each year. The designation has its basis in a revelation to Sister Faustina Kowalska, the Polish sister who died in 1938, concerning the extravagant abundance of compassion available in Jesus Christ. But it would not be necessary to appeal to a private revelation to know that we follow a Lord whose Sacred Heart is on fire with love and mercy for sinners. The cross of Christ, that most public of declarations, is on display around the world to remind us that the breadth and depth and height of divine compassion is beyond humanity's wildest estimations. Saint Gertrude the Great expresses gratitude to God for how divine mercy "has led me through the many obstacles I have placed in the way of your love." Love better by loving with compassion.

Our readings on the second Sunday of Easter from the Acts of the Apostles, the book of Revelation, and the Gospel according to John give us insight into the process of "coming to believe". This journey is indeed a process. When you hear the story of those early days of real community centered around "the breaking of the bread and the prayers," all those "signs and wonders," that singing and praising, you may feel a little thrill—or a little jealous. Our contemporary situation is not unlike being Thomas on the first day of the week: All your friends have seen the Lord, but not you! If an event does not happen to you, it is like it did not happen at all.

Thomas was dead right to demand such an encounter. Second-hand faith is never enough to lose your life for, nor is it enough to save it. Every follower of Jesus requires the reality-shattering experience of an incarnate encounter with God-with-you. If you have not once in your lives leaped to your feet or sunk to your knees shouting, "My Lord and my God!" then it is time you have been given the opportunity. The everlasting love of God comes to you in flesh and blood at every Eucharist. If you have not seen the Lord yet, it is time to demand the revelation you need to buy into the gospel and be church. The hound of heaven waits!

It was that incredibly wise man, author, and wit, GK Chesterton, who about one hundred years ago, said "When people cease to believe in something, they will believe in anything." They are prophetic words, because we live in a world and a society where there is no lack of belief at all - for people will believe in anything provided is different, novel, or unusual. Faith is not about fancy or novelty. It is not without foundation in fact, or in history. Faith's firm foundation is the Good News, the amazing message of what really happened, and the power of Life and Love which still dwells amongst us, full of grace and truth. N.T wright has a message for our questioning world...Jesus' Resurrection is the beginning of God's new project not to snatch people


Please also note, that there will be no confession this Saturday, but Fr. Fr. Frank will be available for confessions an hour before Mass on Saturday April 30th.

This Sunday, April 24, is Divine Mercy Sunday. As a sign of God's mercy at work in the world, Bishop Gary Gordon asks that the full text of Pope Francis' apology for the Catholic Church's role in Canada's residential school system be included in parish bulletins this Sunday. VYSHNEVSKYY FAMILY - ARSON VICTIMS Note from St. Pat's School Principal Deanne Paulson

St. Patrick's students, staff and parents have been collecting toys and clothing for their classmates who lost their home to arson this week. Father Yuri's mother-in-law died after a gas stove explosion in Kiev 3 years ago and, being the only members of their families in Canada, they have been worried for friends and family in Ukraine. As if that wouldn't be so awful to deal with, I can only imagine how devastated they feel after losing their home, almost their lives, to arson. Please keep them in your prayers.
