SUNDAY April 28, 2019 Divine Mercy Sunday

The last fact about Jesus is not that he was put to death, but rather that he has been raised from the dead and that as the risen One, he lives among us and is the source of the hope with which we stand in life. You find it well described in the readings of today: the first believers came together not to bemoan the fact that Jesus had been put to death, but to give expression to the fact that Jesus lives among them. They knew themselves to be empowered by Jesus to be witnesses to his resurrection. But they also felt the inner need to come together to have that faith conviction nourished by the reading of scripture and the sharing of the bread and wine. Those early Christians had a real sense that their fellowship was based on the shared faith of the risen Lord.

Thomas, who missed Jesus' first visit to the disciples, upon seeing him exclaims that Jesus is for him both Lord and God. Many things can—and have—been said about the apostle Thomas and his infamous demand to see the risen Christ in person rather than rely on the reports of the other disciples. Some have vilified him as the arch doubter, while others have praised him for his persistence in seeking out the risen Christ for himself. In the end it shouts to us: Thomas got on board! Taking in the whole story of Thomas at a glance is important because many of us get stuck in this one episode, which reveals Thomas the Problem. It's obvious that John's intention is to provide us with Thomas the Solution, the redeemed one, viewed over the spectrum of his discipleship. Just like Thomas, we problem disciples still have time to get on board. The Lord himself will find another way to draw us into freedom. Neither locked doors, nor even locked hearts, can keep him out. Divine Mercy longs for everyone to wake up and come to the table.

Dear friends, our faith is a great gift from God. But it is not an inert gift that we can lock away like some precious jewel. It is a living gift that needs nurturing to grow and mature. Like other life-forms, faith can wither from neglect. We need to pray about it, think about it, and express it in actions arising from love. This does not mean that we will never have any doubts. But if like Thomas we continue seeking, we too will come into the presence of Jesus and say, "My Lord and my God!"
