From the desk of Father William

Could it be true that someone who had been zealously seeking their imprisonment and death for proclaiming the name of Jesus was now doing the very same thing himself? The community had to receive Paul who had been a block to the "Way" and then instead of being in the way, he was on the "Way". Paul had to live with his earthliness, his past, his violence. Many of the great saints have had to live beyond their histories. Paul learned of the redemptive mission of Jesus, not like the other disciples, at the feet of Jesus. Paul became a disciple by

learning, by getting knocked off his own feet by the Trimmer's pruning voice. That person you are weary of, afraid of, is just another human being with fears and anxieties on the road of life. They may need a bit of time to be pruned! But we can take responsibility for our own personal deadwood. The word of Christ does the pruning, if we present ourselves fearlessly for the Kingdom!

Listen to what he says to us: those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us. In the readings for the Fifth Sunday of Easter, the message seems simple enough: Do what pleases God, follow God's commandment to love in the name of Jesus, and you will receive whatever you ask. What we hear today is from the famous verses taken from the heart of John's Gospel presenting Jesus giving His last discourse to His apostles. In today's Gospel Jesus reminds us that we cannot be Christians without Jesus Christ. "I am the vine, you are the branches". The theme of today's Gospel seems to provide that focus, and it does so in terms that cannot be mistaken. It is our relationship to Jesus Christ, Jesus the risen One, the living One, that is decisive. The unique thing about the Christian faith is that it is not a theory or philosophy that somebody has dreamed up. Rather, at the core of it stands a living person, Jesus the risen One. And our being Christian stands or falls with the way we relate to him. What it ultimately comes down to is what kind of relationship we have with him. How am I, you a branch of the vine?

The simple truth is we are in this together! We can say of each other: "We live from the same source. You live from the same vine as I do." That is what makes us into Church, into the Body of Christ. We cannot be disciples of Jesus on our own. Of course, there are moments when we find the others more of a nuisance than a help, and we may even find them a burden, in being a disciple. And so we figure it may be better to go it alone. Perhaps it may work for awhile. But in the long run, it won't; it will dry up; it becomes empty. When Jesus speaks of himself as the vine, then he says to us: "You together, you with each other are the branches." When we know that about ourselves and about each other, when we acknowledge about each other that we live from the same vine, then we will respect and support each other. And together we will bear fruit, the kind of fruit from which our world will benefit, the kind with which our heavenly father will be glorified. Pray for me please as I lead a retreat for priests this week in Saskatchewan.
