Fifth Sunday of Lent

John's Gospel today teaches us about God's compassionate presence encompassing all. Compassion permeates God's judgment, justice and mercy, and this outpouring of love for us reveals God's deep desire to free us from our guilt and shame. Everyone has dignity and value and deserves respect and reverence.

Tender, sweet compassion flows forth from Jesus to all in this scene. His heart is filled with the love of God the Father and the Holy Spirit as He engages with the Scribes and Pharisees, the crowd, and the woman caught in adultery. Jesus assumes a humble, vulnerable posture by bending down in front of them. He places himself in solidarity with the accused, the woman caught in adultery, humiliated and traumatized by a frenzied mob, and in solidarity with the fears and confusion buried deep within the hardheartedness of the accusers.

The scribes and Pharisees objectify the woman and use her to test Jesus. She is being scapegoated by their judgment and self-righteous attitude. They fear losing power and control, yet Jesus' compassion gives them two opportunities to save face. He writes on the ground with his finger, He stands up and says, "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her" then bends down and writes on the ground a second time.

Now the elders would connect the gesture of using His finger to write on the ground to the story of Moses on Mount Sinai receiving the 10 Commandments written by the finger of God on the two stone tablets (Ex. 31:18). They would recall their history how Moses came down the mountain and 'broke' the Commandments over the idolatry of the Golden Calf and how he had to go back up the mountain a second time to receive new tablets that God wrote on. Jesus doesn't react, argue, push back or humiliate. In gesture and word, He gently turns it back to them for reflection.

An agitated crowd is motivated by their feelings; they become a 'mindless' mob. It's hard to reason with a mob, so Jesus diffuses the crowd by getting them to think, remember, reflect and discern as individuals. God's merciful light reveals their anger and self-righteous attitude, and one by one, they disperse. Pope Francis speaks of God's mercy as "a great light of love, of tenderness. God doesn't forgive with a decree but with a caress". He forgives by "caressing the wounds caused by our sins, because he is involved in forgiveness, is involved in our salvation".

Jesus now stands and looks at the woman with compassion. His tender love and unconditional forgiveness lifts her shame and gives her new life. He sees her as His Beloved, and her dignity, value, and voice is restored.

Jesus calls us to look within and see our need for forgiveness. Hear Jesus say 'I don't condemn you. Go and sin no more.' Henri Nouwen says, Jesus' "compassion makes it possible for us to face our sinful selves, because it transforms our broken human condition from a cause of despair into a source of hope."

In prayer, humility, wisdom, grace, mercy, and love, Jesus' compassion envelops it all and goes beyond by offering a better way, a way out of shame, past sins, our 'self-imposed cages' by opening our hearts to the Voice of Love. Jesus pours out mercy, forgiveness and love from the cross and calls us to walk the road of freedom through His resurrection.

Let God's compassionate love and mercy shatter our hearts of stone so we can forever dwell in the heart of God.
