SUNDAY - April 4, 2021 Easter Sunday - The Resurrection of the Lord

Alleluia! Christ has risen! Like a breath held too long, joy, hope, new life, and gratitude explodes from the empty tomb and shouts out, 'This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad'! Jesus' self-emptying reveals the essence of a compassionate love, a radical redemptive act of love that leads to the cross, a gift of love freely given, and a resurrection love that transforms us if we let it. On this Easter morning, how do we receive this gift?

I come with open hands, a posture of humility and gratefulness, yet grief clings to me. I stand at the entrance of the empty tomb with the stone rolled away and confusion, sadness, and a silent vigil still hangs over me. I'm clinging to the suffering and pain Jesus had to endure; I'm clinging to our intolerance, judgment, and hatred toward each other; I'm clinging to the uncertainties and anxieties of Covid times. And in this time of vulnerability, I hear Jesus calling my name and holding my hand, gently saying, 'Trust, surrender, believe, let go. Let go of your fears, leave them behind like the linen wrappings that bind you and open your eyes to the love that surrounds you'. There is mystery here. In the emptiness, the darkness, and the despair, Jesus brings healing, hope, and new life. His forgiveness and love triumphs over death; God's enduring light conquers the darkness.

Like Mary Magdalene, I recognize Jesus' voice and hear Jesus call me by name and my heart leaps for joy. When you listen to the gospel being proclaimed this morning, put yourself in the scene searching for Jesus, and when Jesus says 'Mary' hear Jesus say your name. Hear how Jesus says your name, for He knows you intimately! Let the significance of that intimate moment wash over you; let the risen Christ transform you, and by your living, go forward and tell everyone!

St Thomas Aquinas called Mary Magdalene the Apostle of the apostles. She is the one who brought the news of the empty tomb to Peter and John, and later, commissioned by the risen Christ in the garden, she announces to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord!' Mary's great love for Jesus kept her in vigil throughout Jesus' passion and brought her to the tomb early that morning. Jesus calls her by name, and her heart reverberates in that love! July 22 is the feast day of St. Mary Magdalene, the first witness of the resurrection and faithful disciple of Christ.

We are called to be joyful and enthusiastic witnesses to Christ and to testify to everyone that he is the One whom God raised on the third day. All that Jesus taught and preached is confirmed. Jesus Christ, love embodied, love divine, Son of God, transports us into Divine love. This all-encompassing Love brings *shalom*, a deep abiding peace that we experience when we are living in right relationship with God and others. Our lives move from self-centeredness to God-centered. We begin to see the world as God sees the world, with eyes of love and acceptance, seeing beyond the exterior to the heart of the matter.

Have we left the tomb? Have we entered into Easter joy? Trust that God is in control. Let Christ be the starting and ending point in our lives for we now live *in* and *with* Christ.

Easter, a time of spring and renewal, sprouting and new growth, a new day dawning that enfolds the darkness. In his book *The Passion and the Cross*, Fr. Ron Rolheiser says 'love triumphs over hatred, peace over chaos, forgiveness over bitterness, hope over cynicism, fidelity over callousness, life over death, and good over evil, always. God has the last word'.
