SUNDAY April 7, 2019 Fifth Sunday in Lent

The readings today take us into the realm of the impossible. Yahweh put water in the desert—impossible; Saint Paul tells us we will attain Resurrection from the dead—impossible; the adulterous woman is condemned by no one—impossible. Jesus staged a cliff-hanger in today's Gospel. Scribes and Pharisees brought before him a woman who had been caught in adultery. Three terms express their sense of dominance: "They caught her." "They brought her." "They made her stand before them all." They bristled with righteous indignation as they asked Jesus for his view. In their eyes, her fate is sealed: it must be death by stoning, according to the law. No one talks about the adulterous man involved. As always happens in a sexist society, the woman gets condemned and the man walks free.

These self-righteous men put the woman in the middle of their circle and demanded that Jesus go along with their plan to stone her. The tension mounted. The men were ready to act. Jesus knelt low and began writing in the sand and invited anyone who was without sin to cast the first stone. The men slunk away. The woman was not only saved—she was forgiven and invited to sin no more. The accusers go away shamefaced. They know that they are guilty of many things themselves.

Maybe we haven't yet managed to unpack all the consequences in Jesus' liberating action in the face of this woman's oppression. Working in a Church that is directed and inspired mostly by men, we often fail to be aware of all the injustices that women keep suffering in all areas of life. So, we keep working and witnessing to the God who loves us beyond our own fears and brokenness. Here is a man Jesus, not conditioned by any oppressive law or power; a few individuals, who never hated or condemned, never returned evil for evil. In his defense of this woman, there is more truth and justice than in our resentful demands and name-calling. Like the Pharisees, we may be tempted to imagine a God in our own image and likeness. A stern, punitive father, who can forgiven only after our abject repentance. This kind of religion can be cold and loveless,

On another note, if it were not for women giving so much of their wisdom and witness in the church a lot would not get done. I want the women of Holy Cross and St. Patrick's to know I am deeply grateful for your witness. Take time to enter into the mystery of Holy Week by reflecting on your own paschal story. The last chance for a Penitential Service is this Tuesday at Our Lady of the Rosary at 7pm.
