Reflections from the Gospel Gals

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever."

In today's Gospel the people are all complaining about what Jesus is saying to them. They know where Jesus comes from; they know his parents...how can Jesus be the bread that has come down from heaven? Jesus tells them all to stop complaining. He tells them that He is telling the truth and he who believes has eternal life. But they are not prepared to accept this, and they do not believe.

But we do, because we are drawn to Jesus; this is our gift from God and the Eucharistic is Christ's promise to remain with us always. This is our faith. But are we open to being transformed so we become more like Jesus when we receive Communion? Are we prepared, are our hearts open?

A few Sundays ago, I painted my first painting. I had a large canvas, acrylic paints and my brush, so I started. Like a kid I wanted to use as many different colors as I could. Let's say my painting was very colorful! The colors were vibrant and bold. But the next day my colors had faded and I found out that I missed a very important step, a canvas needs to be prepped before it is used so that the colors glow.

Our hearts are like a canvas; it too needs to be prepared for receiving the Eucharist.

God's brush strokes upon our hearts are love, acceptance, forgiveness and mercy; there are times when our hearts may not be open to receive His gifts. I am thinking of the times when I am complaining and arguing with Joe about something or other on our way to church, and after mass I hop in the car and pick up on our argument exactly where I left off. Why, because I was not fully present in the moment in Mass and my heart was not prepared to receive, and in this I hurt Jesus. Jesus wants us to receive Him and He wants us to receive Him well. Jesus wants a relationship with us; the more we invest in our friendship with Jesus, the more we come to Him in the union of the Eucharist.

If I can spend weeks cleaning and preparing my home for visitors why am I not spending the time to consciously prepare myself to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, opening my heart and cleaning out those hurts and wounds that sit in the corner like dust bunnies. By going to reconciliation, praying to the Holy Spirit for a good heart, believing God's word and listening to the Eucharistic Liturgy as though I was hearing it for the first time, I can now confidently pray "Oh Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed."

Holy Communion is God Himself. It is really Jesus Christ the Bread of Life. Jesus is the food of eternal life. When we pray the Eucharist prayer we are asking God to unite us closer to himself and to all those in heaven who have gone before us and who pray with us at Mass. Like Elijah, we to must listen to the Angel's message "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you"

So, let us prepare the canvas of our hearts. Let Jesus create masterpieces with each one of us. May we be so bright and shiny that those we meet will see the Jesus within.
