SUNDAY August 16, 2020 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Canaanite woman in today's gospel was in desperate straits because her daughter was beset by a demon. She took the inventive step of approaching someone, a man no less, of another ethnic group because she believed he could help her. And she showed fierce mother love when Jesus was about to dismiss her as unworthy of receiving the message he came to proclaim. The ferocity of her faith made Jesus reconsider not only his response to her, but also his entire role. She taught him that a mother's love knows no bounds—and neither should God's.

Many are uncomfortable with the initial response of the disciples and Jesus to this woman, will prefer to present this encounter as a test of the woman's faith: Did she believe in Jesus "enough" to get the miracle she sought? It seems equally plausible to present this meeting as a test of Jesus' own understanding of his mission. Could he think outside the box of "salvation for the house of Israel"? In either testing scenario, we stand to lose something we value in Jesus: the unfailing depth of his compassion or the omniscience of his vision. Discomfort ensues either way. We may not like the feeling, but no one promised the gospel would be painless.

If anyone is being tested in this gospel story, however, I think the case could be made that it is us. Are we prepared to think outside the box of our own presumptions about who's in and who's out of God's favor? Will we continue to police the borders of the church to make sure no unauthorized or unworthy person manages to get the scraps that fall from the master's banquet of salvation? Life in Tyre and Sidon is hard enough. We to whom grace has been given so freely and without merit might spare a little for our neighbor.

In our fractured world, it is as genuinely desirable as it is practically impossible to imagine all the children of God united in love, humility, and purpose. From the earliest memory of the church, Saint Paul labored long and hard for a reconciliation between Jewish and Gentile believers, but too many clung to what divided the clean and the unclean: the marks of circumcision, dietary observances, and obedience to the Law of Moses. Today, the walls that divide us seem steeper than ever. The day when God's house will be a house of prayer for all people seems very, very far away.

There is dear friends, a natural tension exists between the familiar and unfamiliar, the neighbor and stranger, our kind and every other kind. Even Jesus seems initially to have limited his mission to "the lost sheep" of Israel. A clever woman, a Canaanite, persuades him to think outside the box on this issue. Later, Saint Paul abandons the box altogether, taking the gospel to the Gentiles outright. We're the beneficiaries of that decision. These days, as we wrestle with how much we're obliged to share our land and its richness with others, we might consider the crumbs that fell from the table to us.

A certain good humoured rivalry has existed between the Dominicans and the Jesuits (founded 1540 as typified by the following anecdote, which in this case, the Jesuits seem to have the last word.

"A Jesuit and a Dominican discussed whether it was acceptable to smoke while praying. They couldn't decide on a definitive answer, so they agreed to ask the Superior of the Retreat they were attending.

The Dominican asked, 'May I smoke while I am praying?'

'No, of course not. When you are praying you should concentrate on God, and nothing else.' The Jesuit said 'Let me try.' He asked, 'Is it alright if I pray while I am smoking?'

'Yes, of course. You should pray all the time, no matter what else you are doing."
