Reflections from the Gospel Gals

"We walk by faith; and not by sight."

How many times have you gone through the cupboard searching for something to eat to satisfy a craving? Maybe for something salty, like chips, or something sweet, like cake. You're not sure what you want, but you're looking and often still come away feeling unsatisfied. Food with very little nutritional value often leaves us empty and unfulfilled. We start searching through the cupboards and never really find something that satisfies. Have you ever had a hearty loaf filled with nuts and seeds and made with whole meal flour, or a rich, dense rye bread? And though it may not be what you thought you were craving, your body knows that this is what will provide you with beneficial nutrients. Bread nourishes us, so Jesus uses that term to describe himself. The living bread is an example to reveal more deeply how profoundly he nourishes us.

In the Gospel reading three weeks ago, 5000 hungry people showed up and were fed with 5 loaves and two fish. They didn't understand. They thought it was about loaves and fishes. Two weeks ago, Jesus challenged us to consider the bread that we eat. Is it perishable or does it endure to eternal life? Last week, Jesus declared himself to be the bread of life come down from Heaven. Today he says, "Eat my flesh, drink my blood". This is the only way we will ever have life within us. Jesus is very clear, and blunt about it. His flesh is true food and his blood is true drink. Many of his disciples disputed among themselves saying, "how can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Understandably, the people were horrified and many of his followers were to leave him upon hearing this. His flesh is true food and his blood is true drink. Any other diet leaves us empty, hollow and hungry. "Very truly, I will tell you unless you eat of the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you."

The Eucharist is the food that nourishes the gift of the spirit. The meals we eat satisfy our physical needs. Every week we have the opportunity to witness the mystery of faith by attending Mass and receiving the Eucharist. Jesus says, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Bishop Robert Barron says in his article, Why you need spiritual Food, "The divine life is found in the transfigured bread and wine of the Eucharist. Aquinas said that the other sacraments contain the Virtus Christi (the power of Christ) but that the Eucharist contains ipse Christus (Christ himself).

What the soul is hungry for is the person of Jesus, the body and blood of Christ. Without feeding regularly on that food, the soul will atrophy. If you want to be healthy spiritually, you've got to receive the Eucharist. Every time the Eucharist is celebrated, Jesus gives us himself, telling us, "Abide in me as I abide in you"
