SUNDAY - August 1, 2021 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

God's abundant love created us into being, and God promises to provide for all of our physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual needs into eternity. Think about that for a minute – provide for all of our needs – into eternity! Do we even have the capability to contemplate the largeness of God and God's promises for us? This awareness is beyond our comprehension, for God is the Creator of all things and we are the created, yet God yearns for us to know how much God loves us and provides for us.

God knows us intimately and wants a reciprocal relationship with us. God hears our voice and provides food to sustain our physical needs with a deep desire to provide so much more. God knows that our physical needs must be met in order for us to move beyond the physical to the spiritual. Sometimes we forget that we are more than just physical beings. Like the Israelites, we focus on our physical comforts. Anticipated fears take hold when we enter a wilderness in our lives, and we go into a tail spin. We catastrophize our situation, move into victim mode, and abnegate our responsibility by blaming everything and everyone around us, especially God. We've been asking for a way out of 'Egypt', whatever Egypt represents in our lives today, and God complies by leading us out, but it's not how we envisioned it! We then glorify the familiar rut and can't see beyond our own paradigm.

Physical needs placate our emotions and we can skim the surface of life with relative ease and little commitment. Yet, we are more than physical beings with immediate needs. We have been created in the image and likeness of God, to live the Kingdom here on earth, to be Christ-like to all we meet. When life throws a curve ball and we fall to our knees, we won't ask 'what must we do' and 'what sign are you going to give us' because we know what we are called to do and we know the sign of the rainbow, the covenant, and the miracles of healing and feeding. We are surrounded by the miracle of life every day for our focus is God!

Jesus invites us to believe in him and believe in God, an invitation into a greater way of being in the world. Through prayer, contemplation, reflection, and presence, let us open to the mystery of God, tune our hearts to God's voice, and lock our gaze on God. In the readings today God provides bread (an everyday staple) in an unexpected way (from heaven). Jesus, the incarnation, the true manna, the Bread of Life, rains down from heaven in abundance, filling us beyond our needs and giving us eternal life. An extraordinary promise that calls us to a deeper relationship, to move beyond the physical, to 'clothe ourselves in true righteousness and holiness', to literally become the Bread of Life.

Martin Luther observed:

"God's wonderful works which happen daily are lightly esteemed,
not because they are of no import
but because they happen so constantly and without interruption.

Man is used to the miracle that God rules the world and upholds all creation,
and because things daily run their appointed course, it seems insignificant,
and no man thinks it worth his while to meditate upon it
and to regard it as God's wonderful work,
and yet it is a greater wonder
than that Christ fed five thousand men with five loaves
and made wine from water."

British Columbia Bishops' Campaign in Support of Healing and Reconciliation

The Catholic bishops of British Columbia recognize the need for a province-wide initiative to raise funds to support healing and reconciliation among Indigenous and non-Indigenous people.

This appeal will launch formally in September 2021, at which time further details will be provided.

Campaign Priorities

The goal of the Campaign is to support residential school survivors and Indigenous communities in our province as part of our ongoing response to the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action. This includes projects that promote healing and reconciliation.

As part of this process, each bishop will consult with Indigenous leadership, survivors, elders, and other community members.

The bishops of British Columbia sincerely hope that this Campaign will help to restore trust and further the ongoing journey to truth and reconciliation.
