# **SUNDAY - August 22, 2021 Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time**

"I will walk by faith even when I can not see." - 2. Corinthians 5:7

Jesus said to the people: "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you." This was the tipping point for the crowds that had been following Jesus. Jesus unveiled the mystery of the Eucharist and they could not accept it. They turned their back on Him and walked away. How sad to imagine Jesus standing there and watching them go, but Jesus did not say anything more to stop them. His message had been clear. It wasn't wrapped up in a parable to be interpreted, no metaphors were used, and no further explanation was needed. Jesus then turned to his disciples and asks, "Do you also wish to go away?"

How would we answer?

I believe our answer would depend on how strong our faith in Jesus is. Like Peter, we have our faith filled days and then sadly those days when we too deny Jesus. I'd like to think we could echo Peter's words. "Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life." Peter's response touches our heart. We recognize his faith in his words. Peter may have not fully understood what Jesus had spoken, but he, unlike the crowd, was very close to Jesus; he loved Jesus; he trusted Jesus, he believed that Jesus was indeed "the Holy One of God', and he places his faith in Jesus.

In the second reading Paul shares how we can build on our faith and our connection to Jesus. He asks us, as God's children, to live in love, just as Jesus did, by treating others with kindness, having an open heart, and showing forgiveness. It's a reminder to us that our relationship with Jesus is not just about us; we need to be present for others. We receive Jesus, the Bread of Life, in communion with others. We need community. Pope Francis once said that faith always leads you out of yourself, that faith needs to be transmitted. We've all been recipients of transmitted faith. We all have those amazing people in our lives that live their faith and inspire deeper faith in us. These are the same people who have had the greatest loss and tragedy in their lives, they are compassionate, they listen and they don't judge. They imitate Jesus' way of being, and in loving others they fall deeper in love with Jesus.

This summer I have been fascinated with a climbing clematis I have on my deck. It's amazing how the new leaf stems search for something to grab onto. When it finds a branch it wraps itself so tightly around it. Once the leaf stem takes hold there's no way to separate it from the rest of the plant, even if a section of the clematis dies you still can't remove the stem. Our faith is like that; once it takes hold it's forever a part of us. It's God's gift to us. It may ebb and flow at different times in our lives, but it's still with us. It's this faith that helps us trust in Jesus in difficult times. It's this faith that allows us to trust Jesus more then we trusts ourselves. It's this faith which moves us to believe, even though, we too, like the disciples, may not fully understand.

# Pope Francis urges people to get vaccinated against Covid-19

Pope Francis is making a powerful appeal for people to get vaccinated against Covid-19. In a new video released on August 17, the Pope is joined by Cardinals and Archbishops from across North, Central and South America who speak about the suffering and death the pandemic has brought and the heroic efforts of researchers who developed the vaccines.

"Vaccination helps us protect the most vulnerable", says Cardinal Gregorio Rosa Chávez, Auxiliary Bishop of San Salvador, in the video. "Our choice to get vaccinated affects others. It is a moral responsibility, an act of love for the whole community".

The Pope repeats this message in the conclusion of the video: "Getting vaccinated is a simple yet profound way to care for one another, especially the most vulnerable. I pray to God that each one of us can make his or her own small gesture of love... small gestures for a better future".

In British Columbia, drop-in clinics are open for people who haven't yet received their first dose and for those whose first dose was more than 28 days ago. No appointment is necessary, and anyone born in 2009 or earlier is eligible.
