### SUNDAY August 23, 2020 **Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time**

So what did Peter get when Jesus proclaimed him the rock and gave him the keys? Nothing discernible at the time, we can be sure, except perhaps a warm, glowing feeling that was brutally short (see next week's gospel). What made Peter papabile? To his credit, he was one of the earliest disciples called, and he emerged as the most outspoken of the 12 apostles. Peter was close enough to lesus to become part of the inner circle of three (including Zebedee's sons James and John) who were present for some of the critical hours of Jesus' life. Peter was characteristically passionate and motivated to act-which in an environment of slack-jawed and passive disciples certainly merited some points. But what proved the tipping point in Jesus' assessment was the day when Peter got the right answer to the question, "Who do you say that I am?"

According to Matthew's reckoning, it wasn't that Peter blurted out the correct response by dumb luck or that he shared aloud his long-held private belief about lesus at a well-timed moment. Peter's response was, to Jesus, a sign that the Holy Spirit was with him. Peter's susceptibility to the promptings of grace was far more important than the idea that he might be smart enough to have figured lesus out. Intelligence was nice enough as far as it goes—but the capacity to channel inspiration was what Jesus was looking for in a leader.

On the other hand, much can be said about what Peter was not. His faith faltered in moments of crisis, as when he tried to walk on water. He lacked courage in the face of outside challenge; witness his waffling on the matter of eating with Gentiles in Acts. Peter could not be depended on for loyalty, a failing that grieved him terribly in the time of his historic denial. He was as capable of getting the answer very wrong as well as spectacularly right-but again, we anticipate next week's gospel. It is obvious that Peter was not chosen to lead the church because he was perfect. His appointment did not come as a result of his strengths any more than it did in spite of his weaknesses. What made Peter a good choice, the premiere choice, is that the Holy Spirit demonstrably could work with him. Susceptibility to the Holy Spirit remains the best criteria for choosing leadership in the church today. "Who do you say I am?" Jesus asks. How has your answer to that question changed as you have grown and matured?

Everyone gets promoted to his or her level of incompetence, according to the Peter Principle. That could certainly be said of the Apostle Peter. He showed promise and passion, but to shepherd lesus' followers in their faith was a tall order for the guy who denied Jesus three times. Yet in love, if not in corporate culture, competence is a rather tricky thing to measure—it's all about heart and soul; intention and effort; humility and perseverance. It's definitely not about perfection or stellar performance. Peter kept talking to the Lord and that is what saved him and us. Think of the people you would follow to the ends of the earth: a spouse, a child, a best friend, a mentor, a parent, a sibling. These people are far from faultless, yet they are worthy companions along the way because they love you and are loved in return. Many people have power and influence over us, but only those who love can lead us in faith. Let's put our trust where it can do us the most good: in Jesus and anyone who, however imperfectly, lives in his spirit.

Let us rise with Peter.
