SUNDAY August 2, 2020 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's readings, we are all invited to be nourished by God, to know that as God's beloved, nothing can separate us from God, and with Jesus' encouragement, together, we can bring about the kingdom of God.

In the Ist reading, God invites everyone who thirsts to come, buy, eat, and enjoy the fullness of God without money and without price. What an invitation, what a gift! God calls all of us into this generous, freely offered relationship of Love. How do we respond?

Do we know what we are thirsting for? During these past five months, a lot of people have taken the time to slow down and reflect on their lives, to see what is really important. People are listening to the longings of their hearts, to their hopes and dreams. They want more out of life. 'Things' don't satisfy this longing; rush and busyness create noise and confusion so we can't hear the small, still voice of God; our way of living disconnects us from our heart space. Quality time, sacred space, nurturing family, connecting with nature, resting in the silence and peace brings balance, a connection, a wholeness.

St. Augustine taught that we thirst for God because God has first thirsted for us. God creates this thirst in us and graciously wants to fulfill it. Isaiah offers us water, milk, and wine. Water refreshes, hydrates, and soothes us: "He leads me beside still waters. He restores [refreshes] my soul" (Ps 23:2-3). Milk nourishes and sustains us. Wine lavishly poured at the wedding feast brings good cheer and joy to the heart. So come, receive the gift of Christ, the living water, the nourishment, and the abundant wine that is poured out for our salvation.

Thirst for God! Come, listen, and live within a covenant of "steadfast, sure love." Draw near and surrender to this precious gift freely offered.

We belong to Christ; we are made in the image and likeness of God. Nothing can change that! Scripture shows us time and time again that God remains 'steadfast, merciful, compassionate, kind'. Our covenantal relationship is binding. God promises that nothing will separate us from the love of Christ. Do we believe that?

Covid times have caused great hardship and distress as well. Loved ones dying alone, people feeling lonely and afraid...where is God? We know that God is with us in it all. We can look back on our own graced history and see how God was with us when we felt alone, how trying times made us stronger, created opportunities when we turned to God. God's love and grace conquers everything! Pray for the grace to place our lives in God's hands. Trust that God is in control, have faith and believe!

In today's Gospel, Jesus sees the crowd and, despite his own grief and need for solitude and prayer, his heart overflows with compassion and he begins to minister to them. When the hour is late and the people are hungry, a great miracle happens. Jesus tells his disciples, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." What?! How is this a miracle? Jesus asks us to be co-miracle makers. Jesus wants us. Jesus invites and encourages us to work alongside him, to use our gifts in collaboration with him, to feed one another, to give thanks, to bless, to share with one another at the Eucharistic table.

Covid saw more gardens planted, random acts of music, singing, painted rocks with loving words, neighbours supporting neighbours, people bringing groceries to those home bound. The miracles have been endless!

God invites; I'm called to respond. God says nothing will separate us; I'm called to trust and believe. God says, 'give them something to eat'; I'm called to cooperate and share my gifts to build up the Kingdom of God. Miracles abound for all. Come, eat and receive all that God offers. In God's abundance.
