SUNDAY - August 4, 2024 **Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today's Gospel is the beginning of the discourse on the bread of life that follows the miraculous feeding of the multitude. Some of the people who had been fed by Jesus crossed the lake to find him the next day. They were eager to remain with him. Jesus seems brusque with them, however. He tells them that they are not there because they had appreciated the meaning and seen beyond the sign that he had given them, but because they had filled their bellies and wanted more.

So, Jesus tells them that they should be working, striving, for real bread—bread that lasts and can give eternal life. They then ask Jesus what they must do. What they must do, Jesus tells them, is have faith in him. This makes the crowd defensive, and they challenge Jesus to give them a sign that he is deserving of their faith. We read in the first verses of the Gospel today, how the religious leaders were confounded with how Jesus got from here to there. In a sense, they were asking our human questions about Jesus in the Eucharist, but even more about Jesus as our Lord and Savior. "How did you do that?" Faith is an understanding which allows for the misunderstandables. How did God split the sea? How did God present manna and quails? How did Jesus take five loaves and two fish to feed so many? How is Jesus present as man and Son of God? How is Jesus present in the Eucharist? All particularly good human questions and we, like our Jewish ancestors, can grumble, regret, and take off to the comfort of the easily explainable. Forget those questions and enter the miracle. I do love the Eucharist; it is easy to consume. I surrender to the love that Jesus is, even when I cannot stomach or digest all that love means and invites me to.

Today in this Eucharistic celebration we receive Jesus in word and sacrament. Our openness and receptivity to this is what we call "believing". The life of God in the bread and word is our manna, which sustains us on our journey through our personal deserts. With trust in Jesus, we can move towards greater freedom. It all comes down to trust!! Manna from heaven is what we are all waiting for. But we keep looking up to the sky to find it, instead of in the Body of Christ, namely our sisters and brothers.

Jean Allen writes...you may say, "I believe in Jesus" but here is the cruncher: do you allow him to believe in you? You profess to love him. Do you allow him to love you? You desire to serve the Lord. Do you believe that he also wants to serve you? Growing in capacity to receive Jesus and be fed by him is a lifelong process. As soon as you experience him filling a little hole in your heart, the hole gets bigger! Little by little, he expands your longing and your capacity. Continually desiring and believing in him is the lifelong work of God. Pay attention to your dissatisfaction. Do you know that all the strong desires you have, the longings, the yearnings, the restlessness and aching for more, whether it is spiritual or otherwise, are echoes of his immense and intense desire for you? Saint Teresa of Calcutta said... If you cannot feed a hundred people, then just feed one.

2024/25 Sacramental Preparation Programs for Children/Teenagers of St Patrick's and Holy Cross

Journey of Faith for Teenagers: Learn about the Catholic Faith, what it means to follow Jesus, and how to receive the graces needed to live the Way, the Truth and the Life. This program is designed for teenagers to venture on a faith journey and enter new life in right relationship with God. Students may prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Communion and Reconciliation, as appropriate. ALL STUDENTS AGED 13+ YEARS OLD ARE WELCOME. Each student must participate with a sponsor.

Journey of Faith for Children: Does your child want to learn more about the Catholic Faith? This program is designed for children to venture on a faith journey and enter new life in relationship with God. Candidates may prepare for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Communion and Reconciliation, as appropriate. ALL SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN AGED 9-12 YEARS OLD ARE WELCOME. Each student must participate with a parent.

Together in Jesus First Reconciliation for Grades 2 and 3: Children who are baptized are ready to prepare for First Reconciliation in the Year I group when they reach the minimum age of 7 years old. This program is suitable for children 7-9 years old. Lessons edify their imagination and sense of wonder through storytelling, interactive learning, and prayer rituals. Each student must participate with a parent.

Together in Jesus Confirmation and First Communion for Grades 3 and 4: Children who have received the sacrament of First Reconciliation are ready to prepare for Confirmation and First Communion in the Year 2 group. Candidates who were in the First Reconciliation Year I group at St Patrick's/Holy Cross are automatically registered into the Year 2 group. If your child is not registered and wishes to join this group, please contact the Sacramental Prep Coordinator - Michele Bristow mbristow@rcdvictoria.org.

Please attend one of the Parent Info Sessions to be held on **Saturday Sep 14 at 3pm or Sep 21 at 5:15pm (30 min) at Holy Cross**. The First Reconciliation session for baptized candidates begins on Oct 5. Preparation for Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion begins in January. This year all classes take place at Holy Cross Parish (4049 Gordon Head Rd) before or after the Saturday 4pm mass.
