Reflections from the Gospel Gals

The crowd in today's Gospel was hungry! Imagine them seeking out Jesus when they found that he was no longer on the Mount where he had fed them abundantly – to the point of hopping in a boat and making their way across the sea to Capernaum. There must have been a great attraction for them to get to Jesus because presumably they could have dropped a fishing line and been able to fulfill their own physical hunger along the way. Their mountaintop experience had held some intrigue – this Jesus had divided loaves and fishes and fed so many people! They needed more from him.

Jesus understands this and begins to teach them. We hear his introductory words. "Don't work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For it is on him that God the Father has set his seal." Their reply? "What must we do to perform the works of God?"

Jesus' reply? "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent."

This is the beginning of the Bread of Life discourse that we will be hearing from John's Gospel for the next several weeks. "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." The people in the crowd were baffled.

How about us? Are we baffled too? What is in our boat with us? Are we hungry and looking for something to fill our hunger? Maybe possessions or activities. It may even be what we consider to be good works. What is important for us to realize is that it is not about things or works. It is about belief. God has given us his Son in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This is not a one-time gift – it is meant to be our Spiritual food. The Eucharist is a gift meant to sustain us in our relationships with each other and with God. Receiving the Eucharist worthily with a heart and a mind that embraces its truth and life-giving reality is what we are called to. The Eucharist is meant to be life changing, shaping us as if by a potter, bringing us closer to God and away from our own selfish desires.

The message for us is to take the bread, the bread that is Jesus, pure love itself, and become love.

As God gave manna to the Israelites in the desert, just what they needed at the time, He gives us His Son Jesus in the Eucharist, just what we need today to help us grow into the kind of people we are meant to be. But this is not a passive relationship. We are not to just 'receive'.

We, like the people who pursued Jesus, are called to believe in him whom God has sent. And what does that mean in our lives? We are called to deepen our relationship with God, to turn our thoughts to God in all of the decisions we make throughout the day, to emulate Jesus. Compassion and mercy should lead our way. And when we need rest we turn to our Father in prayer.
