SUNDAY August 6th, 2017 The Transfiguration of the Lord

From Fr. William's Desk

In Scripture, big things happen on mountain tops! Moses meets with God! Jesus preaches the Sermon on the Mount. The transfiguration takes place on a mountain top. Jesus is crucified on a high place called Calvary.

Did you know the "transfiguration" is mentioned in all three of the "synoptic" gospels, each with its own emphasis? In Mark, it is the revelation of the "hidden" Messiah; in Matthew, the

revelation of the New Moses; in Luke there is an emphasis on prayer. The transfiguration takes place on a mountain, which was the usual place for revelations in the Old Testament (and in Matthew's gospel, the Sermon on the Mount). In Luke, it is a personal experience of lesus while he is praying. His experience spills over to Peter, James and John, who see the figures of Moses and Elijah, who represent the Law and the Prophets, and then experience the presence of God in the cloud (the way Moses did on Mt. Sinai) and here the voice that reveals Jesus as "my chosen Son." This is a pretty big experience for three fishermen from Galilee.

From our perspective, 2017 years later, the transfiguration could seem like an odd insertion in the middle of the story of Jesus, but it is meant to help us realize a bigger picture that takes in the whole plan of God. Did you know God has a plan for you? May I offer a question to reflect on while I am away on holidays? Are you an 'accidental" Catholic or an "intentional" Catholic. An accidental Catholic is one 8:30am simply because he or she was born into a Catholic family and simply does whatever 10:30am Catholics do. An intentional Catholic is one who sees the faith as a major motivating reality and strives to live it in an "intentional" way. The accidental Catholic may indeed be a good person, even a holy person, but there is no energy directed toward 9:00am a deliberate consciousness of their faith and baptismal calling. The intentional Catholic makes the effort to look at their day and ask questions like: How have I prayed? What have I learned? How was I loving? How did I serve?

At the Baptism of Jesus, God declared: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." At the Transfiguration these words are repeated, perhaps with 9:00am more drama. The apostles were challenged to listen to Jesus—and then told not to say anything until he had been raised from the dead. When in your life has an event so changed your understanding of the world that you don't know what to do or who to trust? God tells you again; listen to my beloved Son.

EAT THIS BREAD DRINK THIS WINE

Why we do not allow intinction? Why we do not allow dipping the precious host in chalice: first of all, it is against liturgical norms. Also, when people dip the host they might possibly dip their fingers into the consecrated wine and transmit germs. When taking the host from the chalice to their mouth, there is the danger of the precious blood falling upon the floor or the moistened host breaking. Jesus invites us, as He invited his disciples, "to take and eat" and "to take and drink". Please talk to Fr. William if you have any questions.
