Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - December 1,2024 First Sunday of Advent

In his final public address, the late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin said, "A dying person does not have time for the peripheral or the accidental. He or she is drawn to the essential, the important." That is true of the spirit of Advent as well. "The days are surely coming," warns Jeremiah. "Be alert at all times," says Jesus. Days are growing short. Do you trust in the promises of old, that "Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will live in safety"? Do you accept Saint Paul's prayer that I "increase and abound in love for one another and for all"? We begin the new church year in the spirit of expectation: we don't call this season Advent for nothing. Something is "coming, coming," and we're asked to prepare for its arrival. Is it a good surprise or a bad one? Is it something we've been longing for, or something that's going to ruin everything? If we had to decipher this arrival from today's readings, we might say it could go either way. Jeremiah insists wonderful days are on the way, an era of justice and security. Jesus warns that nations will be in distress, the heavens will shake, and people will die of fright. Are we supposed to take our pick? Do we get a choice which way things will go? Yes, we do! Yes, we do. If we are people of justice and right, then the time that is coming will be the best season of all. It will be the answer to prayers, the day of salvation, the arrival of the company to deliver us from every evil right on schedule! But if you and I benefit from systems of injustice and oppression, if we stand on the backs of other people and enjoy good things at their expense, then we should be afraid, very afraid. Because a day is coming that will spring captives into liberation. And the same day will close like a trap on those who oppress. The Advent we get is the one we choose.

Our Advent season is an invitation to hope, a hope that is anchored in God's faithfulness and his all-embracing concern and mercy for us which have taken on flesh in Jesus. It is on this basis that, in the words of the Gospel, stand up and raise our heads high. We can be confident, eagerly awaiting God's always-new beginning with us. That new beginning of God, which is always near at hand, will surely come; and it will transform us into new women and men. It will transform us into makers of peace, doers of justice and lovers of integrity. To that God we like to cling. In that God we hope. How to live until then? With hope—the hope of a prophet who still hopes though he is sitting in prison amidst the siege of his holy city. With watchfulness and prayer, undistracted by the false certainties of the pleasures and "anxieties of daily life." And with confidence, heads held high like a people ready for a new Exodus to freedom, because they know what they have to do and that their "redemption is at hand." Jen Allen writes: there is mystery and freedom in waiting, in being entwined with the Lord in longing, hope and trust and expecting him in eager stillness or still eagerness. "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; yes, wait for the Lord." (Psalm 27:14) Wait for him to come. Watch for him. To do otherwise is utter futility. Perhaps it's enough, this Advent, to focus on these little things. Perhaps it's enough to look up from our cell phones, TVs, newspapers, and computers a lot more to truly grasp what it means to say, "God so loved the world . . ." Be still. Advent is the pilgrimage of waiting. Make quiet your anxious heart. Can you hear it? Someone is coming...

WORD OF THE WEEK

APOCALYPSE

Alternative name for the Book of Revelation, the final book of the New Testament, that describes the end times in symbolic and allegorical language. Apocalyptic literature is concerned primarily with the fulfillment of history and God's purposes and often involves a human intermediary receiving hidden visionary knowledge of future events. We profess in our Creed a belief in "all things visible and invisible."

In apocalyptic understanding, "the neat division between the present age (evil) and the age to come" is broken down, says Brendan Byrne, S.J. in *Words of Faith*. Through God's intervention in Christ, believers enjoy a taste of Kingdom come. Our liturgical worship, particularly the celebration of the Eucharist, is designed to help us step into this timeless divine realm where love is all. What is Advent's relation to the Apocalypse? For many of us, Advent is our happy place, a season of joy and warm feeling. Yet December can be a dark time of long nights and end-of-year regrets. Advent was conceived in the cultural context of winter solstice, when the sun's return was anticipated and celebrated.

Before electricity, longing for the light was bigger than we can imagine. This longing dovetailed with a church season celebrating the return of Christ our Light. "Return" is the operative word. Just as the sun swings back around at solstice, Christians anticipate Christ will come again. Most of us aren't thinking about the Second Coming when we set up the crèche. Yet the two are deeply paired. The Incarnation is the shattering belief that God entered time as one of us, dissolving history as usual. Incarnation opens a door, just as Resurrection opens another. Scripture with apocalyptic themes awaken us to the game-changing reality of our faith. This is why the start of Advent includes Apocalypse. It really is the end of the world as we know it! Apocalyptic literature in the Bible has sparked trepidation over what may happen to our fragile planet and fragile selves. However, the early Advent imagery of the heavens and Earth passing away is not intended to scare us but rather to encourage and assure us that "when these signs begin to happen," whether inconsolable grief at a personal loss or some cataclysm that shakes the whole planet, our redemption is secure. Our place in the hands of God cannot be shaken. Let this knowledge strengthen our resolve to grow in love for God and others. It will work out in the end!
