

From Fr. William's Desk

All of the readings today have an answer to these deep questions! The readings basically tell us: "clean up your act." If we are not sensing the presence of God in our lives, it may not be only because we are half-asleep, but because our hearts are in need of some housecleaning. The good news of Jesus Christ—the Message!—begins here, following to the letter the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Watch closely: I'm sending my preacher ahead of you; He'll make the road smooth for you. Thunder in the desert! Prepare for God's arrival! Make the road smooth and straight! John the Baptizer appeared in the wild, preaching a Baptism of life-change that leads to forgiveness of sins. People thronged to him

from Judea and Jerusalem and, as they confessed their sins, were baptized by him in the Jordan River into a changed life. John wore a camel-hair habit, tied at the waist with a leather belt. He ate locusts and wild field honey. As he preached he said, "The real action comes next: The star in this drama, to whom I'm a mere stagehand, will change your life. I'm baptizing you here in the river, turning your old life in for a kingdom life. His Baptism—a holy Baptism by the Holy Spirit—will change you from the inside out".

The readings of Advent remind us that, as people of faith, we're waiting for two seemingly contradictory things. We're waiting for the end of the world as we know it: for this broken history of ours to be rolled up like a carpet and laid at the feet of the One Who Is to Come. We're waiting for the dissolution of all things, as the Second Letter to Peter puts it. And none of us can feel sorry at the thought that sin and death, evil, violence, cruelty and injustice, war and crime, and disease and pain will be wiped out at last. When we listen to the nightly news, we may all be ready to shout: Come, Lord Jesus!

But that's not all we're waiting for, of course. The coming of our Lord isn't only about saying good riddance to the bad old days forever. We're also eagerly awaiting an astonishing new world "in which righteousness dwells." We're waiting for rebirth as innocent and beautiful as the baby at the heart of our Advent longing. We can dare to hope for these wonderful things because we're preparing nothing less than the "way of the Lord" here. Forget the stairway to heaven. We're building a superhighway! John the Baptist, the highway's advance man, was one of those rare pivotal figures who appreciated exactly where he stood in human history. As a prophet he had the ability to read the future as accurately as the past. He could see the ax poised at the root of the tree of his generation. Heck, he could feel its weight in his own hands. Everything had to come down: That's why he preached repentance. John also knew someone mightier was on the way. That gave him the courage to speak an unpopular message and then to fall like a tree himself, chopped down by the same injustice he came to denounce. Baptism with water could wash away the past. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit would ignite a future beyond every story ever told.
