Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - December 11th 2022 Third Sunday of Advent

"Be strong and do not fear! Here is your God." Today is called Rejoicing Sunday. Today the candle on the Advent Wreath is pink, not purple as on the other three Sundays of Advent. It is meant to express our joy at the nearness of Christ's birthday. Yet, today's Gospel has a serious tone to it! John sends a plaintive question to Jesus directly. *How will I know—for sure*? he asks. Jesus does not scold John for lacking faith, for betraying weakness. Instead, he sends the most wonderful reply to the man with a prophet's heart. Jesus tells John that the generation Isaiah had foretold is now, and the signs Isaiah predicted are coming to pass in him. Jesus assures John that trusting in him will be a blessing.

Why did the Baptist send from his prison cell that urgent question to Jesus: "Are you He that is to come?" Hadn't John recognized our Lord as the Messiah several months previously, at the Jordan, when he proclaimed Him publicly as the Lamb of God? Did John, faced with almost certain death under Herod, have doubts or second thoughts about Jesus?

We never learn how John receives this response. We know his execution soon follows, but we do not know what comfort he derived from this last message from Jesus. John knew he would decrease; he vanishes from the story altogether, in fact. But those words of Jesus now linger in the air for our consideration: *Blessed is the one who takes no offense at me.* Does this mean that we must surrender all doubt to follow Jesus? I am not sure that's possible or even human. The twelve apostles who walk behind Jesus from Galilee to Jerusalem are always mumbling and questioning behind his back. At various times along the journey, they doubt Jesus' wisdom and leadership, or the meaning of his actions and teachings. They also, from time to time, doubt themselves and their participation in this dubious enterprise. Still, when the getting is good and many in the crowd's part company with Jesus, Peter makes the best case for continuing the way: "Lord, to whom can we go?" Faith in Jesus Christ does not banish all doubt. But it does mean walking in his way despite all uncertainty.

Even in my settled heart I am at times prone to doubt! Doubt is not always a bad thing, of course. Often it is the most reasonable response to an uncertain situation. None of us is a stranger to doubt. John the Baptist had a moment of doubt. John the Baptist held plenty of convictions since childhood, no doubt. That he was born to fulfill a great mission is something his parents must have told him early on. His training, his clothing, and his lifestyle all speak of the powerful motivation that drives him to do what he does and say what he says. The bottom line of John's life is quite simple. He understands himself to be the witness, the forerunner, the voice preparing the way. His fate is unimportant, but his mission is essential. We too must be faithful and patient as we follow and serve Jesus!

James presents us with the image of a farmer as the example of faithful living. The farmer trusts in the potential of the seed and the soil. What do I want you to know on this third Sunday of Advent? Be patient! Do not lose hope! God will come with vindication; God remembers his promises; God is faithful to his Word! Be patient, but work as hard as you can to bring about the kingdom. Speak words of courage and support to the poor so they can hear, see, walk and share in the work of the Kingdom of Heaven. Rebuild the place for God among us. Make the temple clean once again, shore up its foundations, raise its walls to the sky and welcome God there at the center of the kingdom that is in our hearts. And know this: know this: God is faithful, God is always present as we see with new eyes, hear with new ears, walk sure footed on the path shown us, work to build up Jerusalem. He is coming and let us prepare and let us rejoice in his promise. Gaudete! Our labor together with God's grace will bring us to the time of harvest beyond all doubt.
