SUNDAY December 13, 2020 Third Sunday in Advent

In the RC liturgical tradition, this Sunday is known as "Gaudete Sunday" from the first word of the Entrance Song in Latin. Gaudete means 'rejoice'! The readings today are much more exuberant as joy is about to burst forth. We are getting closer and the excitement is busting forth as we anticipate the celebration of Jesus' coming among us. We reflect on the words from the **Thessalonians**, a letter written by Paul and is the earliest of Paul's surviving letters. It reflects his genuine love and concern for the community. Today's reading comes from his final statements. "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, giving thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

The season of Advent is a season of waiting - the kind of waiting that is associated with the experience of pregnancy. You may remember that two weeks ago, on the first Sunday of Advent, I suggested that the season of Advent is really an invitation to relive a pregnancy: the pregnancy of Mary. We wait and watch with Mary. I also mentioned that the season of Advent is also an invitation to us as a Church, as a community of believers, as the mystical Body of Christ, to see ourselves, very much like Mary, as Christ bearers to a world so desperately in need of all the saving it can get!

In the last three months of pregnancy, the pregnant woman is weighted with her cohabitant. The heaviness can reach awkward and uncomfortable proportions. While the anticipation of birth fills her with joy, the reality of physical discomfort also calls for attention. It is really a mixture that marks these three final months for many pregnant women: anticipation and excitement, but also inconvenience and pain. Is that a reminder that the Christian life will also know a fair dose of struggle, darkness, and suffering?

If as a pregnant Church, we must give birth to the real Christ, something may have to give in ourselves, in our world, in our Church. Is that what John the Baptist is referring to when he summons us to make a straight way for the Lord? Old ways of relating may have to give way to new ways of relating. A world where forgiveness and trust become the common currency, replacing the outdated currency of revenge and suspicion will indeed be a new world that we, as a pregnant community may be called to give birth to; it will not happen without difficulty and pain.

In giving birth to God in the hearts of humankind, our disposition should be one of joy. The implication is that we Christians should be characterized as a joyful people. We are directed towards joy and thanksgiving because we are deeply aware of how God has acted throughout salvation history and know that he continues to act in and through Christ and his Holy Spirit.

We are halfway through Advent in a year of lockdown and we must accept the pain that comes with

doing the right thing. A lot is stirring in today's readings, and it is all being stirred by the Holy Spirit. What can I say to you to comfort in this dark time? Dear friends, when all is said and done, we only need to know Jesus Christ, to be baptized in his name and to follow him as the one true road through the mess of human history. John testified to this light, and we do too when we embrace the gospel as true.
