SUNDAY December 17th, 2017 Third Sunday in Advent

From Fr. William's Desk

The readings today are much more exuberant as joy is about to burst forth. We are getting closer and the excitement is busting forth as we anticipate the celebration of Jesus' coming among us. We reflect on the words from the Thessalonians a letter written by Paul and is the earliest of Paul's surviving letters. It reflects his genuine love and concern for the community. Today's reading comes from his final statements; "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, giving thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. That is a comforting prayer! A very comforting prayer! Think about it!!!

The season of advent is a season of waiting- the kind of waiting that is

associated with the experience of pregnancy. You may remember that two weeks ago, on the first Sunday of Advent, I suggested that the season of Advent is really an invitation to relive a pregnancy: the pregnancy of Mary. We wait and watch with Mary. I also mentioned that the season of Advent is also an invitation to us as a Church, as a community of believers, as the mystical Body of Christ, to see ourselves, very much like Mary, as Christ bearers to a world so desperately in need of all the saving it can get! If as a pregnant Church, we have to give birth to the real Christ, something may have to give in ourselves, in our world, in our church. Is that what John the Baptist is referring to when he summons us to make a straight way for the Lord? Old ways of relating may have to give way to new ways of relating. A world where forgiveness and trust become the common currency replacing the outdated currency of revenge and suspicion will indeed be a new world that we, as a pregnant community may be called to give birth to; it won't happen without difficulty and pain.


The Jesus that Mary gives birth to, the Christ that we, as a community of believers, are to give birth to, will have a hand in creating a society where prisoners are granted amnesty, where the homeless and refuges are given a place to live, where those who are in conflict with each other, whether it be individual persons or nations will find peace. There is very challenging and very disturbing side to Advent. Advent has nothing to do with preparing for the birth of an innocent baby, resplendent in inertia. Indeed, Advent means taking sides with a God who agitates for reforms and shatters the status quo. It can no longer be business as usual. If the real Christ is to be among us, then we are in for a change.

Come to think of it, I wonder what kind of birth Advent prepares us for? It can hardly be for the birth of Jesus; after all, that birth took place some 2017 plus years ago. Could it be that it prepares us for the birth of a new community in which the face of Christ becomes once again recognizable, but then not a Christ of our own making, that is sweet, innocent and harmless and who, leaves things as they are? Rather it could be a Christ of God's making who turns things in our world upside down. Are we as a pregnant community prepared to give birth to Christ who will transform and renew our world, put it once more on the road that leads to God's kingdom of peace, justice and love?
