

God takes on a human identity, becomes flesh, and dwells among us. God becoming human casts new light on our own identity. We see both Isaiah and John the Baptist wrestling with questions of identity this week. Today's readings are brimful of joy and hope. To help us grasp that we reflect on that joy we hear those beautiful words from the Thessalonians a letter written by Paul and is the earliest of Paul's surviving letters. Today's reading comes from his final statements. "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, giving thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

We are halfway through Advent. Presents have been bought. Preparations for the big Christmas celebrations have begun in earnest, yet our liturgies remained subdued even if they are hopeful. The Good News Isaiah reminds us to proclaim is the same that John announced more than 2,000 years ago. We lose sight of that message if we are not praying constantly--yes, constantly says Paul. We must not hold down the Spirit.

How much of all that we are so busy doing reflects the awesome reality of Christ being born again in our lives? How much joy do we carry with us and share with others? Does the cashier who waited on us in a crowded line feel better for having been in contact with us? Did we respond to the drivers ahead of us in a way that makes them feel better about themselves? Or did we ignore the Salvation Army worker at the kettle or the stranger looking for a cup of coffee? Are our smiles roses that we hand to those who need them? There is still time this Advent to pray and prepare ourselves to bring the greatest gift we can to others--the unconditionally loving gift of our God and Savior born again into our world and our hearts. When God is allowed to be God for us, we find a reason to rejoice. Remember this season of joy is all about a spirit of joyful service.

That is why in giving birth to God in the hearts of humankind our disposition should be one of joy. The implication is that we Christians should be characterized as a joyful people. When in doubt we need to remember that biblical message is an optimistic one. It is the story of a God who cares about us and whose care is such that God is willing to enter our world. Our Christian vocation during this season of Advent is to prepare for Jesus' coming into our hearts so that we may experience the joy of salvation, that healing, that wholeness and holiness we long for and which alone gives meaning to our lives. Jesus gave that kind of answer. Can the same be said of us?
