## SUNDAY - December 19, 2021 Fourth Sunday in Advent

The eve of our salvation is near! That is why we gather on this day, the Fourth Sunday of Advent. What brings us to church today is that we believe something wonderful is happening to us. We believe that God has chosen to be with us, to live as one of us, to take up residence in us as bearers of the life of Christ for the sake of the world! We come together, as a matter of theological necessity, to celebrate that reality, and to share our joy with others who have had the same experience. Like Mary of Nazareth, we may have traveled a long way, an impossible way, to get to this place to share this hour. But the news is so good, we cannot contain it ourselves. We have to share the blessing, declare God's goodness to us, and sing the song of praise.

It is unfortunate that the figure of Mary appears on the scene only today. One would have wished that she had been presented to us on the first Sunday of advent because Mary is a remarkable Advent figure. Mary shows us in living color how the Christian should wait for Christ. It is the kind of waiting that made Mary be a true disciple of Jesus, in fact it made Mary be the very embodiment of what discipleship is all about. It is in discipleship that Mary excelled, and it is in this that she will remain for us a constant challenge and example. It has everything to do with tuning into God's speaking to us and acting upon it. Jesus himself has articulated Mary's way and has enshrined it as the hallmark of true discipleship: "whoever does the will of God, whoever listens to the word of God and acts on it, is my mother, my brother and my sister."

Scriptures do not mention Mary too often, but whenever the Scriptures speak of her, it is always connected with the theme of hearing and doing the word of God. Today's Gospel passage is a perfect example of that. Saying "Yes" to God's word and acting on it is underlined in today's beautiful story. "Mary set out and went quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah". Why? To be with a relative, Elizabeth, for Elizabeth was with child, and Elizabeth was old. Mary was carrying Christ not for herself, but for the world in need. That is Mary, all right. Mary is "blessed" not primarily because she is the physical mother of Jesus, but because she is a prime example of those who listen to the word of God and keep it, observe it, follow it and act on it.

It is this kind of disposition that makes Mary the perfect Advent figure. This kind of waiting for Christ is also within our reach. To wait for Christ's coming we do not have to go back some two thousand plus years ago; we do not have to act as if Christ had not come. Today Christ comes to us in the hungry and the thirsty, in the stranger and the naked, in the sick and the shackled. To be attentive to this kind of coming of Christ, to respond to it and to act on it, that is advent stuff. That is preparing for Christ's coming.

We are grateful for the advent figure, Mary. We let ourselves be inspired anew by her, so that Christ will also say to us, as he said to his own mother, "because you listen to God speaking, and because you act on it, you

are my mother, my brother and my sister." With Mary, you and I and the whole church have been on a pilgrimage to the hour of the savior's birth. The one who from the time of old has been waiting to be born is about to take flesh. Hebrews says that when Christ came into the world, he prayed, "I come to do your will, O God." At this time, recommit yourself to seeking and doing the will of God.

## PASTORAL TRAINING OUTREACH PROGRAM

## **RECONCILIATION CORNER**

<u>A recent article</u> in the *Times Colonist* offers another example of reconciliation. St. Paul's Indian Church at Squamish Nation's Eslha7an (Mission Reserve), erected in 1868 on the north shore of the Burrard Inlet, is the oldest Catholic mission church in the Lower Mainland. It is now integrating Skwxwu7mesh Sníchim (Squamish language) into its Sunday masses. Squamish Elder and Catholic Deacon Rennie Nahanee, who is himself learning the language, "is confident that the church can be a vessel for cultural revitalization, and ongoing education about Squamish language and teachings." He is looking to other cultures (both internationally and locally) – to see how they have integrated their traditional languages and cultures into Catholic celebrations.

## HOLY CROSS ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CHRISTMAS UPDATE

Christmas is a time for us to reflect and share the abundance we have now and throughout the year. The Parishioner's thoughtfulness has enabled our Society to continue to support marginalized people and families. Assistance is given to an inner city school breakfast/lunch project and provides weekend meals to these young students. You were supporting two families, who had children with health issues.
