# From the desk of Father William

Mary is a remarkable Advent figure because she shows us in living color how the Christian world should wait for Christ. There is a form of waiting for Christ that is uniquely Mary's. It will forever remain Mary's unique privilege that the one for whom she was waiting was nestling within her. Not simply in her thoughts, in her dreams, her hopes, her yearnings, but in her flesh. But there is another kind of waiting which is beautifully displayed in Mary. It is a kind of waiting that may in the long run be more decisive for Mary than the first kind, and it is a kind of waiting that does not have to remain uniquely hers, but that can

also be ours. It is the kind of waiting that made Mary a true disciple of Jesus, in fact it made Mary be the very embodiment of what discipleship is all about. It is in discipleship that Mary excelled, and it is in this that she will remain for us a constant challenge and an example. It has everything to do with tuning into God's speaking to us, and acting upon it. Jesus himself has articulated Mary's way and has enshrined it as the hallmark of true discipleship: "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word."

That, at its best, is Mary. She hears God's word and does it. The Scriptures don't mention Mary too often, but whenever the Scriptures speak of her, it is always connected with the theme of hearing and doing the will of God. Today's Gospel is a perfect example of that. Jesus was born because Mary said a free, unconditional and courageous 'Yes'. Jesus became our Savior because he said a free, unconditional and courageous 'Yes'. This Christmas, in union with Jesus and Mary, lets each of us say a free, unconditional and courageous 'Yes' to God. It is the safest investment in security, happiness and peace that we will ever make.



Did you know that the Hebrew word *amen* means "yes," and we say it every time we come forward for the Eucharist? We say yes, we'll be the house of God. We'll take the divine life into our bodies, in flesh and blood, and make it our flesh and blood. We say, "Let it be done to us, according to your word." God's last known address is you.

There is hope in our world. Are we prepared to give birth to a temple within the hearts of humanity? Are we as individuals, as church prepared to give birth to a Christ who will transform and renew our world; put it once more on the road that leads to God's kingdom of peace, justice, and love? Light shines in dark places. Yes Lord, YES!


