

Today, Sunday, December 26th is the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We have just celebrated Christmas, rejoicing in the baby Jesus being born, God entering the world to be with us, his beloved daughters and sons. And then these challenging readings – Hannah leaves Samuel, the child she prayed for and loves with all her heart, at the house of the Lord in Shiloh; and twelve-year-old Jesus is unaware of how desperately his parents are searching for him while he is in the temple sitting among the teachers! Isn't the Holy Family sweet baby Jesus, surrounded by caring protector Joseph and loving mother Mary, rocking him to sleep? The angels are singing, the wise men are bringing gifts, the shepherds are kneeling in awe. A peaceful, comforting, and holy image. How does Hannah's sacrifice, and Mary and Joseph's frantic fear fit into this image?

Unquestionably, the Holy Family had peaceful and quiet days, rejoicing in the gifts of each other. They had encounters in which they were appreciated by people of all stations in life. But the Holy Family experienced much more. They were a refugee family, a family that struggled with communication and confusion, a family that suffered loss, a family that celebrated Jewish feasts, shared the everyday intimacy of work, play, conversation, illness and recovery. They experienced rejection, fear, and disappointment. They were not exempt from the suffering in this world. They were a loving and joyful family and there were also sacrifices, sorrow and at times fear. Our own precious families are not the Holy Family, we continuously fall short of loving unconditionally. But we certainly can relate to the challenges of living as family in this world. There are sacrifices, sorrow and fear.

Jesus was born into a family that loved him and supported him. He grew in wisdom and love in his family. We all grow in wisdom and love in our families, as children and as adults. Our families are not Holy, but our families are refugee families, have troubles with communication, suffer great losses and experience fear and disappointments. Today, as we celebrate the Holy Family, it brings us peace and comfort to realize that our families are made in the image of the Holy Family.

And who is our family? Is it parents and child, grandparents? Is it a parish, a neighborhood, a

country? Mother Teresa once said: "The problem with our world is that we draw the circle of family too small." As Jesus grew in wisdom and love, his understanding of family grew too. As we grow in wisdom and love, our understanding of family also grows, until we realize that all people are our family, all are our brothers and sisters, and once again we rejoice!

PASTORAL TRAINING OUTREACH PROGRAM

The valuable and free Pastoral Care Outreach Training series will be offered online again this winter. Nine sessions will be held via Zoom on Saturday mornings from 9:30 – noon, starting on January 29, 2022, and running until April 9 (with no sessions on March 19 & 26 for Spring Break). Participants who attend all sessions will receive a Certificate of Completion. This course is for anyone interested and will show why those who visit the sick are unique, and how they can offer more than a friendly visit – they can be the hands and face of Christ to others. Until pastoral access to homes, hospitals, nursing homes, and health care facilities is fully available, Bishop Gary Gordon (of the Diocese of Victoria) feels "it is important to have parishioners trained at the ready to provide a caring and compassionate experience to those who are most in need." Participants will require a phone number and email address, a computer, tablet or smartphone with speakers, microphone and webcam, and a reliable Internet connection.
