
Holy Cross Catholic Parish Mission Statement: Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY December 29, 2019 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

In their young lives Mary and Joseph have already had many hardships and struggles. In today's gospel they again meet with very dangerous circumstances. The wise men have left; Herod believes his throne is being threatened and he prepares to take unspeakable action to protect his kingship. In a dream Joseph is warned by an angel that Jesus' life is in danger. The angel tells Joseph to flee immediately to Egypt with Mary and the Baby Jesus.

Then we hear, "Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, by night and went to Egypt" As I reflected on these words, I wondered what was it that caused, allowed, prompted Joseph to immediately do as he had been told,



obedience without question, if not without apprehension and worry. This prompted me to also wonder what was it that earlier had Mary say, "Let it be done unto me according to your word" and yet again what was it that had Jesus, many years later, during his most brutal, unbearable agony say, "Not my will but Yours be done." Each walked into the unknown, a journey of joy, yes, but also of anguish, heartbreak and in Jesus' case a journey to a cruel death on a cross, innocent but convicted and crucified nonetheless.

Joseph, as with countless others of his time and of today, lived everyday life out of the experience and knowledge, the certitude of God within, a consciousness of God present in life. They believed infinite divine love resided within them and God was one with them. They were 'temples of the Holy Spirit'. God was not outside them or distant from them. Knowing the God of love within brought forth in them total and utter TRUST and FAITH in God, gave a joy and peace incomprehensible. While life would surely be wrought with challenges, such as having to flee for safety, they knew the purity of God's love and his solidarity with their suffering; they could be in no better hands, in the hands of God!

As one might expect, I then thought about how I respond to the unknown, to crisis in my own life. Too often I think about God as outside myself, myself outside of God; I pray to God in heaven, not God within. I hurry to get my prayer requests and my intersessions known to God since I believe that my way of seeing how things should unfold and resolve are, of course, the right way. My rational mind tries desperately to understand, reason through and figure out 'why' things happen as they do and I expect God to rescue me from life, since I'm praying for what is good. A while ago, I found myself at emergency with a broken wrist, not a big deal but with a potential for seriousness. Waiting, I began to think about today's gospel. Surprisingly, I waited, hesitated and allowed God to speak first. His words, not delivered by an angel, but, spoken in my heart simply said, "I am here with you, in you, in your pain, in your worry and in your angst." For a few moments, at least, I experienced Joseph's trust, faith, joy and peace. Through God's grace may all of us journey in a relationship of trust with the God within.

Stephen Paine, has been granted a year's sabbatical and thus will be relinquishing his pastorship of St. Edward's Parish in Duncan, St. Louis de Montfort Parish in Lake Cowichan, and Queen of Angels School in Duncan. Fr. Stephen will be engaged in priestly and personal renewal through study, prayer, rest, and will retain his priestly faculties and be in and out of the Diocese during his sabbatical year. Fr. Roger Poblete, appointed Parochial Administrator of St. Edward's Parish in Duncan, and Bishop's Delegate of Queen of Angels School, in addition to his pastoral responsibilities as Pastor of St. Ann's Parish in Duncan. Fr.
