
Mission Statement

SUNDAY December 31st, 2017 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

From the desk of Father William

Today's readings ask us to recognize that God's desire is to make the entire world into one family. We call Jesus, Mary, and Joseph the "Holy Family," not the "Perfect Family." Little is recorded about the three of them together. Simeon's prophecies promise that Jesus will be able to unite all. Families are holy in the intimacy of authentic encounter. Pope Francis writes that: the family that prays, and keeps the faith is a family that experiences joy. I think the invitation of all families is to play their part and do it well. That, I think, is what Simeon and Anna did in their part of salvation history. They have only small parts to play in the story of salvation. But they played them well, as well as they could.

What constitutes a family? It is more than blood; it's also commitment to a cause. Each successful family is a unique mystery of affirmation, negotiation, compromise, and forgiveness. Sustaining one is demanding work, and that needs to be acknowledged and praised. It is ordinary moments of life unfolding that families experience that is holy and true. It is the whispers of the heart that cry to God in praise, longing and hope that speak to what is holy in all of us. The mission of the family is identical to that of the whole Church: to give tangible witness to the vision of Christ for the world. But it is up to us to translate this Christian vision in ways that are appropriate to our time.

There is no perfect family. Some can give help; others need help. We all long to live in a community of peace, unity, reconciliation, and acceptance and with a sense of purpose. It can only happen



when we all work together under the guidance and inspiration of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Holy Family lived through tensions and survived, so can we. Pope Francis writes: How do we keep our faith as a family? Do we keep it for ourselves, in our families, as a personal treasure like a bank account, or are we able to share it by our witness, by our Christian families are missionary families? We must be missionary in everyday life, in our doing everyday things, as we bring to everything the salt and the leaven of faith!

Simeon was clear that the great news contained its own share of pain: for Mary and Joseph, for the child's bitter enemies, and also for his devoted friends. As old Abraham might remind us, you have to commit your faith to the bargain. *Impossible* is just not a word God recognizes.
