
#### **Vision Statement**

### SUNDAY December 3rd, 2017 First Sunday in Advent

#### From Fr. William's Desk

We wait in joyful hope. So begins the new church year, Cycle B, with the season of Advent. The Gospel of Mark will be our text for the next year of Sundays (along with liberal use of John next summer, since Mark is so brief). Of all the liturgical seasons that we go through as a church in the course of the year, the season of Advent may be the most difficult. It has to do with waiting and waiting in December is very difficult. What I would like to do is awaken an appreciation about the waiting of Advent? Why? Advent invites us to relive a pregnancy, that of Mary. We wait and watch with Mary, who consented freely to become the mother of God. Want a faith lift this advent? How do we do that?

We have to keep ourselves—heart and mind and soul and strength—focused on God's will. Our intentions have to be as polished as we go through Mary's pregnancy, and to wait our own pregnancy to give birth to a new way of being as we wait for Christ to come again. Think of how the Jewish community holds an empty chair at the Passover table for Elijah, who hasn't returned in 29 centuries and counting. This could be the year. You never know. But most of us, perhaps all of us, don't keep this kind of expectant vigilance. Maybe the truth is we don't believe an unscheduled guest will ever come, so what's the use? Even those of us who have dedicated guest rooms in our homes use them for storage because, deep down, we're not really open to the possibility of the unexpected. The unscheduled guest is frankly unwelcome. We don't like to have our plans disrupted by something off our radar. We are invited to make room for Christ.

As Advent begins, moments of inner preparation are important. Give ourselves enough undistracted time to focus on how these Advent readings speak to your heart. Light a candle (perhaps the Advent wreath). Close your eyes and breathe deeply, three breaths. Feel your feet on the floor. Be aware of your bodily presence. Now reflect on these questions. How are you distracted rather than alert? What's standing in your way? How have you wandered from God's ways? There is a sense of imminent change in the words of Isaiah and in the warnings of Jesus. Where do you feel the urgency to change in your own life right now? Do you feel that God's face is hidden from you lately? Are you willing to let God be the potter, shaping your life? What, spiritually, are you waiting for? Watching for? What practices help you be alert and watchful? What habits work against that? Keep watch and use our advent booklets to enter into the silence! Why? A lot happens in silence... in truth, everything happens there! Sid Joss shared this with me after a recent visit about silence... in my meditation, I have come to realize how important silent prayer is. Most of our prayers are requests of what we think we need. In silent prayer, God wants us to LISTEN, clear our mind of thought. This is vital. The psychological effect is there is realization from the tensions and its non-verbal only quiet communication. A spiritual rejuvenation...
