




SUNDAY December 8, 2019 Second Sunday in Advent

Today's gospel speaks of wilderness; into this wilderness a prophet speaks his message of Good News. But there is a way out of this wilderness. Knock, knock who's' there? John the Baptist, with some bad news- you have got to change and some pretty good news too—God is coming to help with those changes. Yes, an alternative is possible in this wide landscape called home. A new humanity can be built. There is hope in our world. In Jesus, to whom John points, God's hope entered this world. If we go after this Jesus, if we go his path, then it is God's pledge that we do not find ourselves in a deadend garden cold and alone, but on the wide-open road to a new world where the view and landscape is full of promise.



John, the advent prophet, counsels us to prepare for a coming that will utterly displace the way things are. "Someone is following me, one who is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals." Advent, he tells us, is the season for the new rhythms; it is the season to yearn for a better world and to act as though the New World has already begun. Advent is the season of where we can allow ourselves to be radically transformed by the seed, the mere seed of life within us. If a shoot can sprout from Jesse's aged stump, then hope sure does spring eternal even in circumstances we've given up for dead. Something has to die in order for something else to live, the botanists tell us. Scripture has the same message. We must let go of the past, the old ways, the old self, in order to usher in the new life, we long for. We can't serve two masters, and we can't have it both ways. You want new life? First you have to die to the old one. Saint John the Baptist was sure that the coming of the Messiah meant harsh and just punishment. Yet Jesus arrived, offering opportunities to love and serve and use our talents for the good of the world, even if we might deserve a good kick in the pants. Love beyond all telling!

Advent must give rise to Christian communities who truly believe Christ will transform and renew our world. Light shines in dark places. Let us have the courage to build something new and be a light to the



wider landscape called the world? Let our advent journey be a time of clarifying, healing and rebuilding? Who has acted most like John the Baptist in your lifetime? When have you been the one wielding the prophetic ax? Let us finish, then, with the words of Paul in today's second reading: "Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you for the glory of God." Long is our winter...dark is our night...oh come set us free saving light!
