
Mission Statement

From the desk of Father William

At the time of Jesus, leprosy was an awful disease. It was pretty well the worst form of sickness that could strike anyone. The person who suffered from leprosy was called in some circles the "son of death". What was perhaps even more destructive was the notion entertained by religious people that those who suffered from leprosy were being punished by God and lived under a curse from him. In the biblical world sin and suffering were mixed together. Because of the danger of contamination, and because they were officially declared unclean, lepers lived in segregated areas.

By touching the leper, and by recklessly ignoring the danger of being contaminated, Jesus flatly contradicts the religious people who believed in the fallacy that a leper lives under the curse of God. With that gesture, Jesus underlines his will to heal and God's will to bring life and salvation. The misery of the leper has come to an end. It is for this reason that Jesus dared to knock over some pretty sacred "No trespassing" signs. No law, no conventional wisdom can be so sacred that it can come between him and people who need to be given back to themselves, who need to be given life.

What today's Gospel passage leaves us with is an uncomfortable question: "Do the lepers of our time find a welcome among us who may pride ourselves on being disciples of Jesus?" If not, then I am afraid that the story of Jesus gets relegated to one of those once upon a time stories: beautifully, but totally irrelevant to our world. We'd like to think we're more civilized now, that we don't insist that our modern lepers just cover themselves up and go away. We still mix sin and suffering together in our minds and presume with Job's "friends" the he has somehow called down all this misery on himself. Jesus never approached an outcast with any kind of moral assessment. He saw the mark of suffering, and he willed it—not the person—to disappear. In the New Testament, forgiveness gets a whole new spin.

On this World day of the Sick, are we willing to touch lepers? Will we visit the sick and the homebound, stick with those in our communities who face misfortune, and remain faithful to members of our family who reveal to us what we don't want to see. Will we stand for a culture of life in a culture of death ? Are we willing to look the homeless in the face, and to develop respectful relationships with people regardless of their race, ethnicity, gender, orientation, religion, ability, or social class? Finally, we have to find the will to challenge any attitude, behavior, or structure that keeps people outside the camp of social concern. We have to will that no one be considered unclean or unworthy.
