SUNDAY - February 13, 2022 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

At the beginning of his mission Jesus invites his disciples and us to get our allegiance straight. Deciding the proper choice is hardly difficult, yet the dichotomy Jesus sets before us challenges the very assumptions of our society and the ambitions of our hearts. What makes us get up in the morning? Do we rise each morning with wealth on our minds? Is our fidelity to the Lord such that we stand with the downtrodden, or walk with the grieving? To be a disciple, Jesus clearly implies his new followers that following him requires an upheaval of priorities and a reordering of one's life. Through a life poured out in love, may we be filled with God's very own life-giving presence and thereby come to know the power of the resurrection.

The Beatitudes are the starting point for the heart of Christ's message: love must dominate the heart of the Christian disciple. Jesus is fulfilling His role as prophet. He is announcing how He intends to live and predicting how He expects to be heard and received. He is inviting His listeners to follow Him as prophets of "root-changing." In a world full of protests and unsettled hearts we all need to be silent and pray.

I would like you to think of the Beatitudes as God's letter of recommendation to you outlining all that you have going for you and why you should persevere despite setbacks, bad odds, and major catastrophes such as lockdowns and restrictions on our freedom. We have all been blessed in one way or another. We have all received our share of good fortune. . . . A single blessing is all the bounty in the world, and if you have been blessed at all you are meant to pass some of that on. You are meant to set a positive example. That is our responsibility.

Keep the Beatitudes nearby in these difficult days and reread them a hundred times a hundred. Much of modern life can seem, spiritually, like stretches of wasteland. Yet in even the bleakest of surroundings, some people's spirits flourish and thrive. They stay connected to the sources of life. What can you do to "plant yourself" where living water flows? Here are a few ideas: Receive the sacraments regularly. That means frequent Mass and Communion and regular

participation in the sacrament of Reconciliation. Practice forgiveness both in the giving and receiving. Lose yourself serving others. Pray daily, early, and often. Offer hospitality to others. Share your faith with others whose faith is alive. Open your heart to grace throughout your day. It will keep you green and growing.
