From the desk of Father William

Wherever we stand with our response to God's choice of us, Lent is the time to measure it. We are summoned to reconsider our baptismal beginnings, to rededicate ourselves to a continuing conversion. For what is conversion but our progressive acceptance of God's choice for us? Our ever increasing acceptance of that choice will make us into new men and women, into Easter people. This is the Easter hope and the Lenten possibility. The God who is mighty and faithful has done great things for us in Jesus Christ, and he will continue to do great things for us to the extent that we submit ourselves to the death- resurrection process.

So, with courage and hope, we enter into the journey from ashes to Easter, confident that we will come out of the journey as new people, because the God who makes all things new is a faithful God. Deserts can be places of beauty!

After Jesus' dramatic baptism account in Mark's gospel, Mark hurls us, ready or not, into a lonely and barren wilderness - a desert, where everything either bites or burns or stings. For many of us, the desert is probably not something that we would consider visiting for a longer time, or spend the rest of our lives in. Why go into the wilderness where life can get so miserable - where plants shrivel, every venomous snake thrives, and every blistering ray and every irritating little grain of sand is in abundance? Mark in his account wants us to know that there is something else true about deserts; something comforting that Mark wants us to hear. *Jesus has been there*. That's the Good News of Mark's opening scenes. No desert on earth is so remote, so barren, and so seemingly inhospitable to life that Jesus has not walked there first. Maybe that's why God so often uses the desert as a place for transformation. Maybe that's why Jesus emerged from the waters of baptism only to be thrust into the wilderness.

How do we reconcile our beginning of this season of Lent—what is supposed to be an austere time of introspection, repentance, penance, and forgiveness—with the bright image of the rainbow? It is most unlikely for Jesus to see a rainbow as he prays in the desert. Like Jesus, our 40 days in the Lenten desert will be filled with temptations and wild beasts bent on drawing us away from the task of reconnecting ourselves with God. God promises that God's loving presence will always be with us. God makes a covenant with us, and the rainbow is a sign of that promise. But when we go searching for rainbows we seldom find them. They seem, rather, to find us, to appear when we least expect them to. This Lent, perhaps it would be better not to spend our time in the desert scanning the horizon. We might be looking in vain for what is already present in our own hearts.

Remember the rainbow,
