SUNDAY - February 18, 2024 First Sunday of Lent

Welcome to Lent There is a reason for this season, too, and it is not to make Catholics feel bad for 40 days. The focus of this season is not the size of our sacrifice in fasting, prayer, and alms, nor frankly is it the agony of Jesus' own ordeal in the final week. A clue to the reason for our observance of this season can be found in the overlooked second reading from I Peter. Lent is the time when we remember God's benevolent patience. Jesus invites us to an exciting journey. "The kingdom of God has come near, repent, and believe the Good News." We are invited to change to go into the desert of our lives and ask some very important questions. Questions like, am I living a life worthy of my calling? Am I an ambassador for Christ? Do I love like I should love? Well, if you find yourself stuck, at a dead-end street and wondering where to go may I suggest you take a chance on God? Jesus was driven into the desert to seek, clarify and gain focus. Lent is our time to seek, clarify and as Jean Allen writes... *the place for us to recognize and be able to let go of everything that we have mistaken for the face of God.* It is our opportunity to leave behind the things, behaviors and habits that hold us captive. It is now or never!!

The Lenten period is a time in which we allow ourselves to be hit again, as it were, with God's choice of us. How far have we allowed God's choice of us to take hold of us? Are we indeed responsive Covenant partners? Or do we allow God's choice of us to be frustrated or compromised, not intentionally, of course, but because our response weakens or peters out? Wherever we stand with our response to God's choice of us, Lent is the time to measure it. We are summoned to reconsider our baptismal beginnings, to rededicate ourselves to a continuing conversion. Today, some of our neighbors are going to make a countercultural choice. They are going to sign the Book of the Elect, signaling their decision to be baptized, confirmed, and to receive their First Eucharist at this year's Easter Vigil. These Elect have been studying for months or years to embrace the life of the church. Why would anyone make this choice in the 21st century? For some, it may have begun as intellectual curiosity. For others, it is a journey of the heart. For all, it is what they have seen in folks like us that make Catholic Christianity an inspiring choice. Let us help keep the inspiration going! Henri Nouwen writes... every time I make a little leap, I catch a glimpse of the One who runs out to me and invites me into his joy, the joy in which I can find not only myself, but also my brothers and sisters.

Repent and take a leap of faith this lent.

Word of the Week:

Papacy

The office of the bishop of Rome, familiarly known as the pope; the term of a pope's reign; a succession of popes; the church's system of government with the pope as first among equals with authority over all other bishops. Since the first century, the bishop of the local church in Rome has been understood to possess the "Chair of Peter," which endows great authority and carries the role of special keeper of the church's mission. The power of the papacy stems from Jesus' choice to set Peter in authority over the rest: "You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church." (Matthew 16:18). Papal primacy and the role of the pope as Vicar of Christ and pastor of the whole Church, with "full, supreme and universal power over the Church" was confirmed at numerous ecumenical councils, including Vatican II (Lumen gentium, 22). The feast of the Chair of Peter (Feb. 22nd) honors the unity of the worldwide church and its teaching authority. This authority has given popes the ability to speak out for human rights and against injustice, which they have done with increasing frequency in the past century. Dip into the social teachings of recent Popes and be amazed by their thinking on labor, preferential option for the poor, human dignity, economic justice, and care of creation.
