# **SUNDAY - February 25, 2024**Second Sunday of Lent

This Sunday, February 25<sup>th</sup>, is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Lent. The Gospel of Mark tells the story of Jesus taking Peter, James, and John to a high mountain. And [Jesus] was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. It must have been an astonishing sight. No wonder Peter, James, and John were terrified. Not only was something supernatural happening to their friend, but Moses and Elijah appeared and began to talk to Jesus. Many of us would have collapsed to the ground and hidden our faces. Amazingly Peter was able to speak, though maybe not rationally. However, he was aware enough to hear the voice of the creator. "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!" What a tender, loving phrase – my Son, the Beloved. These are the words of a loving and appreciative parent. It is reminiscent of what happened when Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist at the beginning of his ministry. Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." (Mark I:10–11)

It is as if the three years of Jesus' ministry were framed by God's love, support, and approval. God blessed Jesus and his ministry. God blessed all the love, healing, compassion, and words of Jesus. And this time, at the transfiguration, God spoke to Peter, James, and John. After declaring Jesus as the beloved son, it was followed by the simple and powerful directive – *listen to him!* Two thousand years later we too can hear these words. We too are urged to listen to Jesus. And the words of Jesus are life giving! Words on how to live: Love one another! As I have loved you, so you must love one another. (John 13:34) Words of inspiration: Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing. (Luke 23:34) Words of comfort: And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time. (Matthew 28:20) So many precious words to fill our hearts and minds!

After almost three years of sharing the good news, healing and leading, it was clear that Jesus was more than a prophet. Jesus was divine, united with God the Father, showing everyone how to live in love. Jesus was our redeemer. Even after the transfiguration, the apostles who had witnessed the happening were not sure what

this rising from the dead could mean. We, too, cannot understand it completely. But Paul assures us in his letter to the Romans that nothing can separate us from the love of Christ, absolutely nothing, including death! If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? We are the sons and daughters of God. Let us listen to the words of love and mercy.

#### A Canadian Pastoral Letter on Ukraine, Canada, and the Church

February 24 marks the second anniversary of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. National representatives of Orthodox, Catholic, and Protestant communities, in collaboration with the World Evangelical Alliance's Peace and Reconciliation Network, the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada, and the <u>Canadian Council of Churches</u>, have signed a <u>Pastoral Letter on Ukraine</u>, <u>Canada</u>, <u>and the Church</u>, inviting all to join in praying for peace.

"Without in any way minimizing or ignoring the suffering and sorrow caused by war and violence in other areas of the world, we stand together in inviting Christians and all people of good will to prayerfully consider how we are all called, and might contribute to, the achievement of peace in and for Ukraine." — excerpt from the Pastoral Letter.

Endorsed by 45 leaders, the Letter identifies six meaningful ways by which to foster peace: Pray, Support Ukrainian Refugees, Urge diplomatic steps towards a just and sustainable peace in Ukraine, Seek cooperative relationships of humanitarian support, Remember February 24, 2022, Hope for reconciliation

The President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Most Rev. William T. McGrattan, Bishop of Calgary, supported by the CCCB's Executive Committee, is one of the aforementioned signatories to the Letter, now available in English, French and Ukrainian. You are invited to share these links to pray and work together for peace.

# Word of the Week:

# **Agnus Dei**

Latin term for "Lamb of God." A title given to Jesus by John the Baptist (John 1:29); the litany sung or said by the assembly at Mass before Communion ("Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world . . .") introduced into the Roman Rite in the seventh century by Pope Sixtus; an image of a lamb often with a halo and a banner and cross used as a symbol of Christ; a wax disc sacramental. The Passover lamb is the symbol of God's people passing over from slavery and death to freedom and life (Exodus 12). A "lamb led to slaughter" is Isaiah's prophesy of God's faithful servant (Isaiah 53:70). The victorious Lamb in Revelation is the light of God's holy city (Revelation 21:9-22:5). With all of salvation history as its backdrop, the Agnus Dei epitomizes the sacrifice of Jesus who achieves our freedom from sin and death. "It is love to the end," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation, as atonement and satisfaction (616). Make a Lenten practice of repeating "God loves me," and share the Good News of God's love with others. In doing so. Saint Paul declares that we will all be transfigured if we keep our sights trained on Christ.


