Reflections from the Gospel Gals

I am home and full of gratitude for the gift of my sabbatical. I want to begin my weekly bulletin reflection by thanking the Gospel Gal's for their contributions to our bulletin reflections over the last 8 months. The female perspective is so important to hear in our church and they did an amazing job. This week's readings is a fitting theme for me as I return to resume ministry: the call and demands of love. Jesus and Paul understood the call and challenges to love. I think we all do!

Citizens of Jesus' hometown loved having a celebrity to claim as their own, but when Jesus suggested that God might claim foreigners ahead of Israelites because of their welcome to prophets, the Nazoreans proved his point by attempting to run him off a cliff. They resented and resisted the idea that one of their own could teach them anything. So they found a way to shrink-wrap his message to the size of their narrow hearts: "Isn't this Joseph's boy? Paul for his part had serious problems in the Church at Corinth. People were dividing into opposing groups with all the rancour we can see in today's societies and yes, even in on our Church. The readings invite us to remember who we are. Remembering who we are is central to our life of faith.

At the heart of our life as disciples is the vocation to love. "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things." Bearing, believing, hoping, and enduring, we will have become everything we are meant to be. Nobody ever said that living out First Corinthians 13 would be easy. Because if it's true that love never fails, it's also true that love is not always the first impulse that clutches at our hearts when dealing with others. Normally we might wade through envy, irritation, rudeness, and a sense of superiority well before we get around to love. Jesus learned all about the shortcomings of human love when he got up in the hometown synagogue to give a teaching.

For my part, I am still learning how to love, mostly from my mistakes. It's hard work! I am guessing that hearing the words of Saint Paul to the Corinthians read at all the weddings I have been privileged to witness over the years might finally be sinking in. Or maybe I have just grown up and moved beyond external symbols and trappings. I don't know for sure. So, I'll just keep trying the best I can to be a loving person believing my faith will make it all clearer as I go along.

So how do we put Paul's word to work today? Start by thinking of one hurt you've endured at work or home or even in our parish recently, and ask yourself whether you responded in love. In other words, were you patient, kind, and not quick-tempered or brooding? If you can answer yes, then congratulations, you have found a most excellent way to live. Without love all our gifts are silent. It is good to be home. I thank Father Karam for filling in for me in my sabbatical and wish him well in his ministry in Nanaimo. I thank you for welcoming him.
