From the desk of Father William

The days for Ordinary Time are numbered as Ash Wednesday overtakes us mid-month (14) - which turns Valentine's Day into a day of fasting and abstinence. Plan ahead, lovers: Make dinner reservations for Shrove Tuesday (Mardi Gras) instead. Time flies! Before I know it, June I will arrive and I will begin my 8 month sabbatical and that will fly too. Season in ... season out we keep our eyes on Jesus! We need to keep our eyes on Jesus, don't we? Life can be tough, just ask Job. Here is a man who has had enough of it. He has had too many beatings. So many, in fact, that he cannot make any sense of life anymore,

and through it all, he cannot make any sense of God either. And the beauty of it is that he dares to say so. Indeed, he does so in a language that may shock us, a language that religious people consider improper for believers.

The beauty of Scripture is that there is room for people like Job in it. The few verses that we see in today's first reading are only a sample, and a mild one at that, of the way Job, in all his suffering and in all his honesty, pours his heart out. He does not know where to go with his pain, with the stupidity and the senselessness of life that he experiences. So he brings it all before God, and not in very pretty or pious language. In his screaming out to God, he curses the day he was born and he challenges God to see whether he can make any sense of the misery that he is enduring. When his religious friends, with the best of intentions, come to console him, Job is not very impressed. When they suggest that he suffers as a punishment for his sins, then he declares his innocence. When they suggest that in his misfortune, God is putting him to the test, he boldly says that he has no use for that kind of God. And you know something: at the end of the book of Job, the author has God appearing on the scene. And contrary to what we expect, God does not back up the arguments of Job's friends. No, God takes the side of Job. He does not accuse Job of a lack of faith. In fact, he commends him. The Job who has protested, who has rebelled, who has cursed the day he was born, is declared to be God's friend. And that is what brings Job's healing, because he has experienced God in a new way.

What Job has discovered is that when we bring our pain and suffering before God, then the true God will not leave us out in the cold; he will not turn a deaf ear to us. A faith that in the tragic circumstances of life can only speak to God in tears, in lamentation, and in complaint is not a weak faith; it is an authentic faith. What are the alternatives? Give up on God or trust that God is on your side and will carry you through? May our journey use the bumps and potholes of life to discover God's will for us. May our way lead us to joy in doing God's work. May our path discovery harmony with the heart and mind of the Father and there discover a banquet of peace and joy.
