SUNDAY - February 5th, 2023The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

February is a month of transition. Light lengthens our days and brings warmth to the air. The earth begins to waken from its winter slumber and new life reaches out from the soil. Ordinary Time starts its shift into Lent. Today's readings call us to live God's justice, to proclaim God's glory, and to let God's light transform our hearts. Let us wake from our sleep and let our Christ light shine in greater and broader ways!

The first reading is a good precursor to understanding our Lenten fast. Isaiah calls for a fast from affluence, indifference, and privilege. God defines fasting by caring for one another, being just, nonjudgmental, merciful, affording food, shelter, and clothing to those in need. We are called to exercise works of justice and charity, to be compassionate at home and in the world through loving thoughts, words, and deeds. Fasting isn't about earning God's approval or losing weight by giving up chocolate; rather, it's about being spiritually renewed, letting go of our control, trusting in God, and surrendering to God's will.

Are we contributing to the heavy yoke of sin and oppression? Are we rigid in following the 'letter' of the law rather than the 'spirit' of the law? Are we stingy with our love and mercy? Do we spew gossip, slander, and hatred? We need to take the time to examine our conscience and see where we stand. God is here for us and offers us the light of salvation. How do we respond?

St. Paul comes before the people of Corinth as a witness, a servant to the gospel, relying fully on God's strength. He's made the transition. It isn't about us, our self-reliance, rhetoric or wisdom, it's about God, the mystery of God, and the power of God. The Spirit breathes through Paul, and God's word and presence pours forth. He is God's ambassador. This same Spirit breathes in us, gives us the right words, enables us to live more deeply God's justice and mercy, and fills us with courage to proclaim God's glory. Ask, pray, be open to receive, and surrender.

Jesus tells us that 'we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world.' Both images propel us into the world in a prominent, distinctive, and intentional way. In Jesus' day, salt was a valued commodity. Roman soldiers were sometimes paid with salt, giving rise to the saying "worth his salt." Salt was also used for preserving and giving flavor to food. As followers of Christ, we are precious and valued by God, sent to preserve the gospel values and give flavor to life. Others can see the difference and are attracted to the faith filled joy within.

When we are traveling down the highway late at night, the brightness of the city lights draw us safely in. As people of God, we are called to live in the world as God's light by boldly shining our light and reflecting the beauty and goodness of God. People are drawn to us, to our steadfast, God-graced demeanor, like moths to the light.

We know that Jesus is the light of the world, yet here Jesus is saying 'we are the light of the world!' What a great pronouncement AND a great responsibility. God's word is truth; God trusts us with this responsibility; God supports us; God waits for our response. Let the Son of God transform our hearts, so together, our light can dispel the darkness and bring warmth and new life to the world!
