# SUNDAY - February 7, 2021 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

How do we proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ? What words, thoughts, or actions do we use to tell others about a loving, generous God who "heals the broken-hearted and binds up their wounds"? It is such an important message to tell at this time as we face "Covid exhaustion". Many people are cut off from their families and communities, from the human voice and the human touch; our hearts need to know that God is 'great and abundant in power and God's understanding is beyond measure'.

In the Ist Reading St. Paul tells us that we are "entrusted with a commission" to proclaim the Gospel, a directive that is more important than our personal rights for we are Disciples of Christ. We have an obligation to proclaim the good news for the spiritual well-being of those who have ears to hear and for the greater glory of God.

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus reminds us to listen to God's voice above all else. He has been healing the sick and casting out demons. News spreads quickly and people come to him to be freed from their afflictions. Jesus wants to free us from our infirmities and knows that we need both a physical and a spiritual release in order to open our hearts to hear God's will for us.

Jesus knows the endless need for healing, and he goes out alone to pray, to reflect and listen to his Father's voice. Taking time with God through prayer enables us to reconnect with God's will for our lives, to focus on God alone and not the competing voices that pull us away from our true calling. Healing is an important part of his calling, yet Jesus knows he is called to proclaim God's message through the healing.

The healing of Simon's mother-in-law seems like such a simple healing and almost self-serving when she is healed and continues to serve them like she always has, yet there is more to this story than meets the eye. She has a fever, a debilitating symptom that could quickly lead to death, especially in the pre-penicillin world (sound familiar with Covid and our need for a vaccine?). Jesus "came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them." Let's take a closer look at Jesus' actions as he enters the house after teaching and performing an exorcism in the synagogue. He's exhausted! Yet without hesitation, Jesus goes to her. He touches her, taboo in a culture between non family members and the opposite sex. And Jesus 'lifted her up' or 'raises her up' as some translations say. Jesus does all this then the fever leaves her and she begins to serve. If it was just about a healing, that would be the end of it, but this is about fulfilling a call, our call to do God's will.

Jesus's gospel message is a call to discipleship. Through this healing, Jesus brings fulfillment, an immediacy, a directive to serve rather than to be served. Jesus releases Simon's mother-in-law of her illness and restores her to her community so she can fulfill her call to serve and offer hospitality and sustenance to others. His gentle touch brings healing, a soothing release. His physical touch also portrays a call to be family in a new way, as we come together as the body of Christ. The call to be 'lifted up, raised up' is the call of forgiveness, mercy, reconciliation, transformation, resurrection, and eternal life with God.

Jesus seeks his Father and asks, 'what is your will for me'? As we seek Jesus, what healing needs to take place so we are able to live into our call to build up God's kingdom? Our responsibility is our response to the abilities God has given us to bring about God's kingdom.

# JOSEPH B. JACKSON UVIC BURSARY AND HOLY CROSS CATHOLIC CHURCH CAMOSUN BURSARY

Our Bursaries continue unabated during the Covid-19 Pandemic. It is with pride that we review the incredible impact of the generosity of Holy Cross Parishoners. There is approximately \$350,000. of capital in the Bursaries from which currently ten or so Awards are made each year. The Bursaries were established in 1988 and 1989 in honour of the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ordination to the Priesthood of our founding Pastor, Father Joseph Jackson. Each year we receive heart warming thank you notes from a number of the recipients. In her thank you note, Branwyn writes that she is looking forward to "giving back" once her programs are complete. Her plans are to assist low income individuals in accessing government benefits when they are unable to provide proof of income. She has been inspired by the assistance she has received from our Bursary and when she was a student of Fr. William's at Queen of Angels many years ago.
