Aldous Huxley said of love: "There isn't any secret formula or method. You learn love by loving." At every crossroad, at every bump in the road in your relationships with others, this is a simple truth to put into practice: Learn to love by loving; learn to forgive by forgiving. It isn't any more complicated than that. That sums it up!!!! "Here's another way to put it: we are here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world. God is not a secret to be kept. We're going public with this, as public as a city on a hill.

When Jesus calls us the light of the world we should stop and listen. That's an amazing proposition, considering that we regard him in the same way. He dares us to take that light and bathe the whole world with its brilliance. Well, how are we doing? How many people know we are Christians, by our love or by any other means? A fish on the bumper sticker of the car or a smudge of ash on the forehead just isn't enough. We can wear a cross around our necks or read our Bibles conspicuously during the coffee break, but that doesn't necessarily shed any light on our convictions.

No, the best way to be the light of the world is to shine before others through our example. We are called to be the Christ-bearers, bringing our little pueblo light before us as a testimonial of the greater light of Christ that we have witnessed. If we bear no light in our coming, then we can gesture all we want in the darkness about our faith, and no one will believe us or even comprehend what we are talking about. The only way to reveal the light is to be the light. The piercing of human darkness with a single ray of light is more powerfully convincing than all the religious chatter we are capable of.

When we are being told by Jesus that we are the salt of the earth, the light of the world, then I don't think it is out of place for us to object, like Paul and the other prophets, to God's foolish choice of us. But we must also be prepared to let ourselves be won over by God's grace, for it is God's pledge that with his power at work in us, we can perform deeds we never thought capable of. It is all part of the fact that in God's eyes we are, despite our weakness and insignificance, the stuff of which God's kingdom is build. We have got all it takes to build the city of God. God's blessing is with us always, shining a light into the world for those seeking abundance. What do you contribute to life's enhancement? How do you engage in the Lord's "seasoning" of the world? The Prayer of St Francis, 'Lord, make me an instrument of your peace ... etc.', sums up the teaching of Jesus: 'You are the salt of the earth ... you are the light of the world'. You are the salt of the earth. You are a light in the world. Aren't you? Good deeds are a shining light, the gospel says. In what ways do your good deeds glorify God? How can they be done for God through others? Saint Catherine of Siena said it best...be who you were created to be, and you will set the world on fire!
