## SUNDAY February 16, 2020 Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's continuation of the Sermon on the Mount contains twenty long verses about what has been heard in the past and what is to be listened to now. We may be taken aback by the demanding way in which Jesus interprets a few of the Ten Commandments in today's Gospel passage. He does not simply recall them. He does more than that. He radicalizes them. It is no exaggeration to suggest that in some ways, the Ten Commandments have fallen on "hard times". We don't hear them mentioned very much. And when someone does, we tend to dismiss that person as being out of touch, as belonging to a bygone age. And yet, there is no way for us as Christians to get around the Ten Commandments, particularly not when we consider that rather ruthless way in which Jesus speaks about them. He does not mince any words. "Do not imagine that I have come to abolish them", he says, "I have come to complete them". Words of this sort, when they come from Jesus, should make us take notice.

Why is Jesus so blunt when it comes to the Ten Commandments? Why will he not hear of abolishing them? Why does he go so far as to radicalize them? For Jesus, they are meant to serve, to protect, and to promote the sacredness of human life and the sacredness of relationships. It seems to me that is what we have to rediscover about the Ten Commandments. Some of us find them outdated; others want to have them clearly reinstated. In both instances, though, what we often have seen to lost sight of is what the Ten Commandments are meant to serve: the sacredness of human life and the sacredness of human relationships.

In these examples, Jesus challenges us with an entirely new and different way of looking at morality. Morality is not a matter of what is explicitly commanded or forbidden. In other words, it is not enough for us, as disciples of Jesus, to say: "I have not killed anybody; I have not committed adultery; I have not broken any oaths." The kind of morality Jesus urges us to is one of responding fully and creatively to the real needs of human life and community. In the way Jesus brings the Ten Commandments before us, he sketches a lifestyle that is shaped by radical respect for others and full solidarity with others without exception at all times.

Jesus summons us to a lifestyle that is different, that is new, a lifestyle that we are not capable of by our own power, but that becomes possible for us bits and pieces by the power of God's grace at work in us. So we pray for ourselves and for each other that God's transforming grace may re-create us into new men and women - new men and women who will not rest until God's law has come to fulfillment in us and in the world around us, for we know that only then will we be fully human for the glory of God and the well-being of the human community.

If you choose you can keep the commandments, they will save you. Father William
